The Coaches

American University is coached by **Shann Hart** (Norfolk State '88), who is in her fourth season leading the Eagles, and seventh overall as a collegiate head coach. Hart has a career record of 111-81 [.578]. Hart led American to 18 wins last season, the most since the 1997-98 season. She is assisted by **Glenn Rigney** (Miami '79), **Deb Reardon** (Assumption '86), **Brian Johnson** (Drexel '98) and graduate manager **Quintina Walker** (William & Mary '02).

UNC-Asheville is coached by **Betsy Blose** (James Madison '84), who is in her second season with the Bulldogs. Blose owns a career record of 117-102 (.534), including a 3-25 record in one season at UNC-A. Blose is assisted by **Faisal Khan** (UMBC '99), **Tammy George** (UNC-Charlotte '93) and **Makia Staves** (Shepherd College '02).

AMERICAN UNIVERSITY WOMEN'S BASKETBALL



LAST TIME OUT

The American University women's basketball team opened its exhibition season last week with a 75-50 victory over Four Corners. The Eagles were led by **Chanel Spriggs**, who scored 20 points on eight-of-17 shooting. Spriggs also had four rebounds, four steals and a pair of assists.

American led by 13 at the half and put the game away with a big run early in the second half. The Eagles built the lead to 25 points just five minutes into the half as junior **Kim Salem** and senior **Kaitlin Schuyler** scored eight of the half's first 14 points. AU eventually built its lead to 33 with five minutes left in the game.

The Eagles had a balanced scoring attack as four players finished in double figures. Junior **Joanna Barnes** was second to Spriggs with 13 points, including three treys. Salem added 12 points and Schuyler finished with 11 points.

The Eagles' defense helped cause 28 turnovers and they finished with 15 steals. American took advantage by scoring 30 points off of turnovers. AU also outboarded Four Corners by four (43-39).

In the first half the Eagles raced out to a 13-point lead (38-25), led by Spriggs, who finished the first 20 minutes with 14 points on six-of-11 shooting. Four Corners cut the deficit to five (25-20) with 6:18 left in the half, but AU went on a 13-5 run to close out the first stanza. Spriggs started the run with a three-pointer, and followed with two more buckets, while junior **Angel Jordan** hit a pair of jumpers to finish it off.

THE OPPONENT AND THE HISTORY

This is the first ever meeting between American and the University of North Carolina at Asheville. Both teams come into tonight's matchup with 0-0 records. UNC-A went 2-0 in its exhibition season, defeating Mars Hill, 81-65, and Carson-Newman, 72-64. Junior forward Meridith Grant led the Bulldogs with 23 points and 12 rebounds versus Carson-Newman. Senior Tonisha Jackson, a 6-3 center, is the Bulldogs leading returning scorer, averaging 12.2 ppg last season.

ON THIS DATE

American defeated Sacramento State, 82-41, at home on Nov. 21, 1997, for its second of 10 consecutive wins to start the season. The Eagles finished the 1997-98 season 23-7, and were invited to the WNIT, the best season in AU history.

SPRIGGS THIEVERY

With 217 career steals, senior guard **Chanel Spriggs** ranks sixth on the AU all-time career steals list. If she continues on her current pace -- she nabbed 110 steals in her sophomore season and 107 last year, good for sixth in the NCAA in steals per game -- Spriggs will easily break the all-time school record of 244 steals, set by Jody Thornton between 1983 and 1987. Spriggs 110 steals in the 2001-2002 season set the school's single-season record for most steals. She established new AU, Patriot League and Bender Arena records with 11 steals against Holy Cross on Jan. 26, 2003. Meanwhile, **Chanel Hunt**'s 83 steals in the 2002-03 season were the fourth most in a season in the history of the program. Hunt is just 19 steals away from breaking into the schools top-10 list for steals.

UP NEXT

American hosts Howard University on Sunday, Nov. 23. Game time is set for 4 p.m.

HOME, SWEET HOME

AU women's basketball has accumulated a 114-77 (.597) record in the friendly confines of Bender Arena, since the facility opened its doors on Jan. 23, 1988. American has had a winning home record in 12 of the last 13 seasons, going 102-51 (.667) during that span. Last season, the Eagles racked up 10 wins against just two losses in Bender. American hosts 12 regular season home games this season.

KEEPIN' IT CLOSE

The Eagles participated in 13 games last season in which the final score was decided by single digits. American was victorious in nine of those 13 contests, with two of the losses coming in overtime.

SEASON OPENERS

American University women's basketball is 20-17 in season openers since the 1966-67 season. Head Coach **Shann Hart** looks to even up her record in season openers tonight versus the Bulldogs. Hart has a 1-2 record in her three season openers at American. The last time UNC-A won its season opener was 1991.

PATRIOT LEAGUE PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

American has been selected by the Patriot League's coaches and sports information directors to finish second in the league. Ten-time Patriot League regular season champion Holy Cross was selected to win the league this year. The Crusaders were a near-unanimous selection to win the regular season title, with 14 out of a possible 16 first-place votes and 98 points. The Eagles were selected second with 84 points.

Meanwhile, junior forward **Chanel Hunt** was selected by the league's coaches and SIDs to the 2003-04 Preseason All-Patriot League Team. She was joined by Courtney Davidson from Navy, Katie Macfarlane from Army, Maggie Fontana from Holy Cross and Desire Almind from Bucknell. Hunt was among the league leaders last season in scoring (14.4 ppg), rebounding (7.3 rpg), assists (2.5 apg), steals (2.5 spg) and field goal percentage (.507).

HUNT(ING) 1,000 POINTS

Junior forward **Chanel Hunt** enters the 2003-04 season with 649 points, including 417 points last season (14.4 ppg). Hunt needs to average 13 ppg over the 27 scheduled regular season games to reach the 351 points needed to attain 1,000 career points. If Hunt maintains her 14.4 ppg scoring average from last season, she will score her 1,000th point on Feb. 20, 2004, at home against Holy Cross. Hunt would be just the 11th Eagle in school history to reach four-digits in scoring. Felicia Young is the school's all-time leading scorer, with 1,708 points.

RETURNING EAGLES

Three starters and nine letterwinners return from last year's 18-11 squad. Starters **Chanel Hunt** (14.4 ppg, 7.3 rpg), **Chanel Spriggs** (10.9 ppg, 3.7 spg) and **Joanna Barnes** (6.2 ppg, 3.7 rpg) made up 48.4 percent of the Eagles offense last season. Meanwhile, key reserves **Kaitlin Schuyler** (5.2 ppg, 2.6 apg), **Angel McNatt** (2.9 ppg), **Kim Salem** (2.7 ppg) and **Jenyce Woodruff** (2.5 ppg) all will look to make significant contributions this year.

BALANCED SCORING

Six different players took home top-scoring honors in individual games in the 2002-03 season. **Chanel Hunt** led the way, leading the team in scoring in 12 of the Eagles 29 contests, including a season-high 34 points against Navy on Feb. 11, 2003. **Chanel Spriggs** led the team in scoring in nine games, while **Katryn Costenbader** scored a team-high in points in six games. **Maria Werries** led the way three times and **Joanna Barnes**' 18 points versus Bucknell on Feb. 8, 2003, was her lone game leading the team in scoring.

Scouting Report

UNC-Asheville: The Bulldogs enter this season looking to rebound from a 3-25 season last year. UNC-A returns four starters from last year's squad, including the team's leading scorer, **Tonisha Jackson**, who poured in 12.2 ppg. The Bulldogs return 75 percent of their offense from last season. Guards **Kristal Hood** (10 ppg, 2.9 rpg) and **Lindsey Roche** (8.3 ppg, 3 rpg) return to the starting lineup, as well as forward **Shantell Waiters** (8.1 ppg, 6.8 rpg).

Newcomers **Meridith Grant** and **Brittany Hendley** led the Bulldogs to a 2-0 exhibition record, with wins over Mars Hill College and Carson-Newman. Grant averaged 15.5 ppg and 9 rpg, while Hendley tossed in 14 ppg and added 3.5 apg. In addition, newcomer **Velinda Vuncannon**, a junior guard, added 5 ppg and 5 apg. Jackson scored 13.5 ppg in the preseason.

DISHING THE ROCK

Senior guard **Kaitlin Schuyler** has 223 assists in her three seasons at AU, good for eighth all-time. Schuyler passed out a career-high 83 assists (3.5 apg) in the 2001-02 season, and followed that up with 75 assists in 29 games (2.6 apg) last year. In her freshman campaign, Schuyler dished out 65 assists in 23 games (2.8 apg). For her career, Schuyler has given out 2.9 assists per game. If she continues on that pace, Schuyler has a chance to move into fourth place on the school's all-time career assists list, behind Danielle Blackburn (340), Karen Jenkins (396) and the school's all-time leader, Jody Thornton, who had 693 assists between 1983 and 1987.

DISHING THE ROCK, PART II

Junior guard **Joanna Barnes'** 10 assists at Navy last season (2/11/03) tied her the third-highest total in a single game in school history. All-time career assist leader Jody Thornton had 12 assists versus Virginia Commonwealth University in 1984 and 11 assists versus University of North Carolina at Wilmington in 1985. Meanwhile, Karen Jenkins tallied 11 assists in a single game twice -- versus UNC-Wilmington and William & Mary, both in 1992.

SCHUYLER: SHARPSHOOTER

Senior **Kaitlin Schuyler's** 92 three-points rank her sixth all-time in school history. Through her career, Schuyler has made 92 of 332 attempts (.277), which places her 10th all-time on the career three-point shooting percentage list. Schuyler just 13 treys behind former teammate Maria Werries 105 career three-pointers, and could take sole possession of second place this season.

THE NEWCOMERS

Head coach Shann Hart and her coaching staff bolstered the Eagles depth this past offseason by bringing in a highly touted recruiting class. Freshman **Kimeshia Junkins**, a 6-3 center from Columbus, Ohio, will be counted on to provide the Eagles with a post presence. Junkins was named MVP of her high school team, and performed well in the Eagles exhibition game versus Four Corners with two points, four rebounds and two blocks in 11 minutes of action. Senior **Courtney Spellacy** is a 5-8 guard who transferred to American from Div. III Lewis & Clark College, where she earned two letters and was named Rookie of the Year. In addition, Spellacy finished second in the nation in assists per game (5.6) in her sophomore season and fifth in free throw percentage (89 percent). Freshman guard **Tara Williams** comes to American from Newport News, Va., where she starred for Heritage High School. During her time at Heritage, Williams was named to the All-District Second Team three times, was named the *Daily Press* Player of the Week, was a two-time team MVP and earned the best defensive player award. Finally, junior transfer **Tala Hadavi** joins the Eagles from Virginia Commonwealth University. Hadavi will sit out this season because of NCAA transfer rules.

BUILDING ON SUCCESS

The Eagles' 18 wins last season were tied for the third-most in school history, behind a 23-win season in 1997-98 and two 20-win seasons in 1985-86 and 1986-87. AU's four league losses last season were the second least for the program, and its .621 win percentage was the fifth-best. The Eagles' 1,888 points were the fifth-most all-time, while the 2002-03 Eagles scoring defense, which gave up just 64.6 ppg and allowed opponents to shoot just .376 overall, was the best ever for an American squad. Last year's squad also ranked in the top-five in school history in average scoring margin, field goals made, field goal attempts, three-point field goals, three-point attempts, three-point defense, rebounds, assists, blocked shots, steals, turnovers caused, personal fouls and disqualifications.

BUILDING ON SUCCESS, PART II

If past results against the Eagles 2003-04 opponents are any indication of future performance, AU should have a successful season. The Eagles have a combined 102-51 (.667) record against the opponents on this season's schedule, and have a winning record when playing 13 of their 16 opponents which they have previously played. The Eagles records against 2003-04 opponents are as follows: Army, 4-3; Brown, 5-4; Bucknell, 6-3; Colgate, 5-1; Elon, 0-1; Holy Cross, 0-5; Howard, 8-6; Lafayette, 10-0; Lehigh, 7-2; Liberty, 4-0; Loyola (Md.), 6-2; UMBC, 5-3; UMES, 8-1; Mt. St. Mary's, 4-5; Navy, 10-7; and William & Mary, 26-11.
