- 1. Complete the Common Application.
- 2. Identify yourself as a Phi Theta Kappa member on your completed application.
- 3. Submit a letter of recommendation/ verification from your Phi Theta Kappa faculty advisor.

Renewal Requirements

Specific conditions for the renewal of the PTK scholarship will be included with the notification of the award offer.

REQUIREMENTS FOR CONSIDERATION

- ☐ Transfer student
- Member of Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society
- ☐ Minimum 3.5 GPA
- 45 or more credit hours at the time of application
- U.S. citizen or international student

ADMISSION APPLICATION DEADLINES

March 1: Priority deadline for all components of the application for students seeking merit-based scholarships and need-based financial aid.

July 1: Final deadline for fall admission without scholarship consideration.

FINANCIAL AID APPLICATION DEADLINE

March 1: Priority deadline for the federal processor to receive the FAFSA and for the College Board to receive the CSS/Profile.
