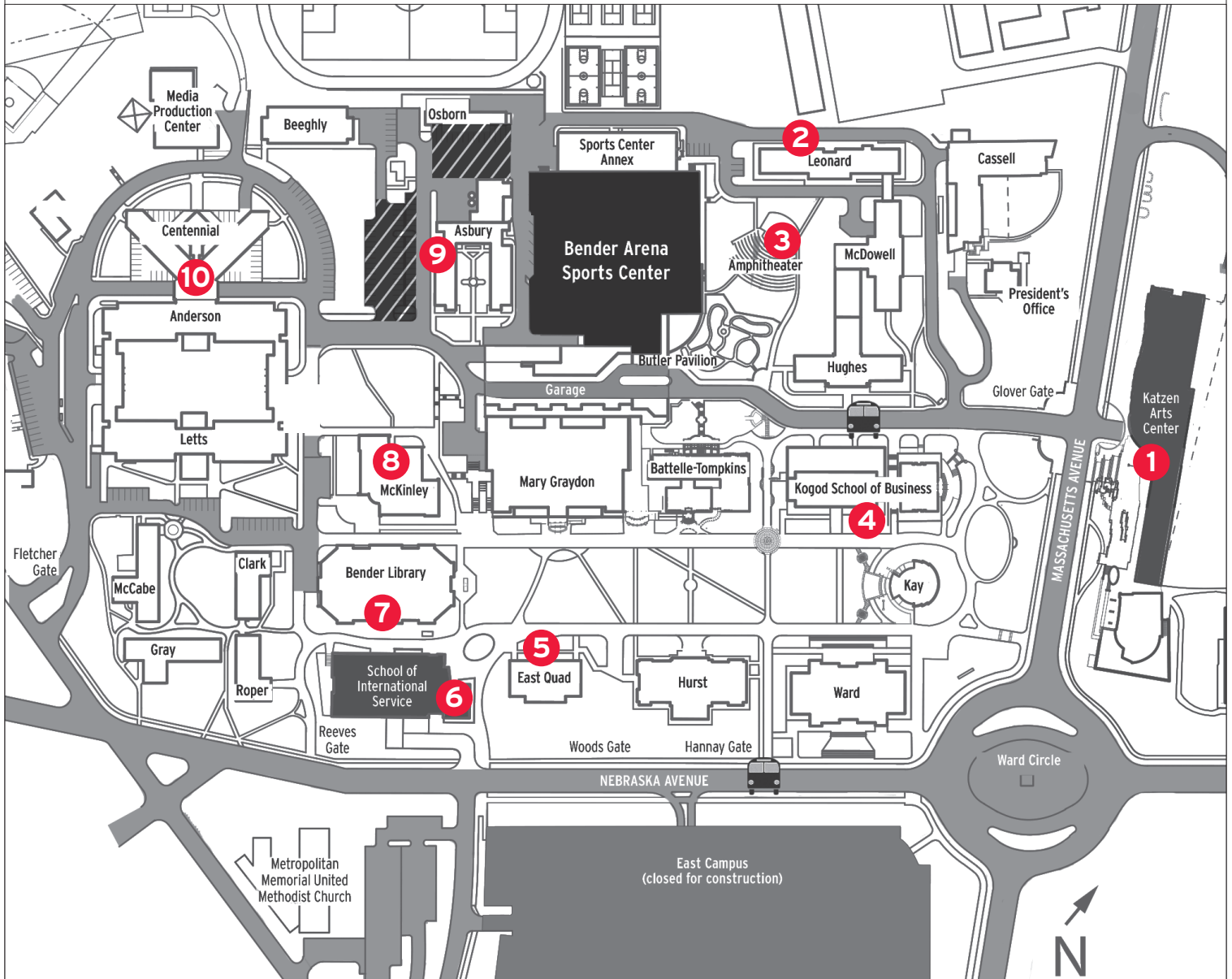




# STUDY SPACES ON CAMPUS
