Saving Green



1. Visit your local library instead of purchasing new books
2. Set your computer settings to 'energy saver' mode (volume 1, issue 9)
3. If you use batteries for any of your electronics, make sure they're rechargeable
4. CFLs, CFLs, CFLs...
5. Turn off lights when not in use
6. Water conservation: check for leaks and turn off when not in use
7. Now that the weather is turning warm again, give line drying a try
8. Plant a garden to give "eating local" another meaning
9. Save paper: print on both sides and don't print out what you can read on screen
10. To save a few cents per gallon, make certain your vehicle's tires are fully inflated, wheels are aligned, the air filter is clean, the gas cap is neither missing nor cracked, and that large, heavy items are not weighing you down
