AU Abroad	Program for students studying abroad in an AU sponsored program, (formerly the World Capitals Program.)
Eagledata	Web-accessible source for university statistics and reports
Full-time	Undergraduate degree seeking, nondegree and certificate students and law students taking 12 or more credit hours, and graduate degree seeking, nondegree and certificate students taking 9 or more credit hours.
Full-time Equivalent	Calculation for part-time students, which is derived by dividing the average load of all full-time students into the total student credit hours of part-time students at the same degree level.
Law	Includes all students in the Washington College of Law, including JD, LLM, SJD, nondegree and certificate.
Maintaining Matriculation	The enrollment status of graduate students not registered for course, or thesis / dissertation credits.
Nondegree	Students enrolled in regular university courses who have not been admitted to a degree program. Unless otherwise noted, excludes law.
Part-time	Undergraduate degree seeking, nondegree and certificate students and law students taking fewer than 12 credit hours, and graduate degree seeking, nondegree and certificate students taking fewer than 9 credit hours.
Student Credit Hours	The sum of the credit hours per student course registration
Washington Semester	A one-semester intercollegiate program for non-AU students.
