## STUDENT ENROLLMENT

The enrollment in the University for Fall 1970 is shown in the first two tables in terms of on-campus and off-campus students. Since a few students register in both categories, some minor adjustments are incorporated to eliminate duplications.

Student enrollments by major field are shown in two ways - 1) the fulltime undergraduates by class, and 2) all students, by level of degree objective, and by parttime or fulltime enrollment. The definitions used make some distortion apparent. For example, a student in his first year who did not complete successfully a full 30 hours (under the semester credit hour system in effect until Fall 1970) would be classified again as a freshman in his third semester. The overall effect is to exaggerate the size of the freshman class and, to a lesser degree, to understate the size of each of the other classes.

Formal declaration of a major is not required until the junior year and thus another factor which needs to be considered in the use of this information is the tentative nature of the major recorded for freshmen and for many sophomores as well.

The determination of fulltime or parttime status is based on University definitions. For undergraduates, fulltime status was, prior to Fall 1970, enrollment for twelve semester hours or more, and as of Fall 1970, enrollment for three or more full courses. For graduate students, fulltime status was defined as 12 semester hours or more for Fall 1966, but this was changed by Senate action to 9 semester hours or more from Fall 1967 to the present.

## FRESHMAN CLASS PROFILE

The freshman class profiles are based on the traditional measures of the qualifications of entering students, namely, the index on the secondary school academic units completed by the student, the rank in the secondary school graduating class, and the scores on the College Entrance Examination Board Scholastic Aptitude Tests, Verbal and Quantitative.

Apart from the questions which arise concerning the validity of these measures as predictors of probable success in college, the "profile" format carries with it the defect of not showing the specific combination of the four items as presented by each student. Taken for what they are - arrays of the distribution of each of the four items - the profiles can be useful in gaining an understanding of the strengths and weaknesses which will be found among the students in an entering freshman class.

## RETENTION

## COURSE ENROLLMENT

The tables showing the combined Fall and Spring course enrollment data for 1968-69 and for 1969-70 in terms of course enrollments by majors and non-majors provide some perspective on the constituency served by each teaching unit. The teaching units are listed across the top of the table and the comparable general categories of major fields are given in the left hand column. Non-degree students are shown in the category "No Major". The underlined figure in each column is the number of course enrollments by students majoring in fields within that teaching unit. Please note that the figures report the student enrollment in courses regardless of the credit hour "value" of the courses, and thus have no uniform relationship to student credit hour production.

The table on average class size by level of course within each teaching unit should be used only in the context of the basis used in determining those averages, namely:

- 1) Only the lecture portion of the lecture-discussion section or lecture-laboratory course was used.
- 2) All independent study, individual music lessons, and thesis and dissertation seminars were excluded.
- 3) Practice teaching and laboratory only courses were excluded.
- 4) All off-campus courses were excluded.

## FACULTY

The definition of fulltime teaching faculty (as reported in the first three of the following tables) is that used by the American Association of University Professors in conjunction with that organization's annual survey of teaching faculty salary and compensation averages. Briefly, these figures exclude both university wide and school/college administrative personnel. Faculty with less than one half time teaching responsibilities are also excluded although faculty on sabbatical are included. Until Fall 1970, faculty in a nursing school were excluded from the AAUP salary survey. To eliminate duplication, faculty with joint appointments are included in only one teaching unit. Thus, the number of "teaching faculty" shown in these three tables may not coincide with the number of faculty associated with a given teaching unit.

The fourth table shows, for Fall 1970, the number of individuals holding faculty rank who were not included in the "teaching faculty" as defined above.

A more accurate indication of the actual fulltime teaching resources of each instructional unit may be found in the five year summary table titled "Faculty Load" and the more detailed table for 1969-70 under the same general title. The basic fulltime faculty figure is the sum of the regular and the fractional appointments in a given teaching unit. It also includes any proportion of time, "contributed" or otherwise, of a faculty member whose appointment is in another teaching unit or who holds an administrative appointment and also teaches. Faculty on sabbatical for the full year are excluded. In short, the figures in these tables are based on the actual teaching effort rather than on the number of individuals, as such.

The parttime faculty figures include both the usual parttime appointments and the graduate assistants who have responsibility for a specific course. The amount of course work handled by part-time faculty is, for each teaching unit, converted to a "fulltime equivalent" figure based on the average course load of the fulltime faculty in that unit. The "FTE" faculty is the sum of the fulltime faculty effort and the parttime effort after it has been equated to fulltime. These figures relate only to faculty teaching courses on-campus.

## CLASSROOM UTILIZATION
