Kyudok Hong is a professor in the Department of Political Science and International Relations at Sookmyung University in Seoul, Korea. He received his Ph.D. and M.A. in International Relations from University of South Carolina, and B.A. from Korea University. His research interest centers on international security matters --chemical and biological weapons, arms control, RMA, and terrorism. He has also had a long standing interest in UN and international organizations, the U.S.-Korea relations, the Vietnam War, and theoretical approaches to the study of international relations. He is now serving as a member of the Expert & Eminent Persons Group of the ASEAN Regional Forum and security policy advisor to the CINC, ROK Army, General Kim Pan Gyu and has also served as foreign policy advisor to the National Security Council at the Blue House during the past two years. Since June of 2002 he has been a visiting professor at American University.
