Yael Warshel is a Lecturer and Doctoral Candidate in communication at the University of California, San Diego, where she is conducting research on Palestinian and Israeli children's reception of Palestinian and Israeli peacebuilding versions of *Sesame Street*. She has received support from Israeli and Palestinian studies organizations alike for her research. Situated in debates about whether communication foments or ameliorates political conflict, she examines the interpretation and impact of efforts that use communication for social change – primarily to manage ethno-political conflict. Her most recent publications address the contributions of communication and media studies to peace education and opinions of Jewish-Israeli children on watching *Rechov Sumsum/Shara'a Simsim* amidst armed political conflict." She received her MA from the Annenberg School for Communication at the University of Pennsylvania, and BA from University of California, Berkeley. She has implemented policy and conducted research on communication and conflict issues for the Truman Research Institute for the Advancement of Peace in Jerusalem, the Center for International Development and Conflict Management, and for UNESCO. Her regional areas of expertise are Africa and the Middle East.
