

**The U4 Anti-Corruption Resource Centre ([www.U4.no](http://www.U4.no))** is the leading knowledge resource centre assisting development agencies and practitioners to more effectively address corruption challenges. Based at the Chr Michelsen Institute in Bergen, Norway ([www.cmi.no](http://www.cmi.no)), U4 pursues its mandate through publications, operationally-relevant research, training, and a helpdesk service based at Transparency International in Berlin. U4 serves eight donor agencies: AusAID (Australia), BTC (Belgium), CIDA (Canada), DFID (UK), GTZ (Germany), MinBuZa (the Netherlands), Norad (Norway), and Sida (Sweden) as well as the broader development community. U4 currently has a full-time staff of nine, supported by CMI managerial and technical staff.

- Providing research support to U4’s work on measuring impact of anti-corruption interventions
- Creating/updating thematic pages on the U4 website ([www.u4.no](http://www.u4.no)), in addition to our selected literature database
- Providing administrative support to conferences and panels

Specific duties would be determined based on the experience of the intern. We cannot provide funds for this position, but we can offer the opportunity to engage in new thinking around issues critical to development aid effectiveness, and a friendly environment in a beautiful corner of the world (when it’s not raining...).
