### SAMPLE SCHEDULE

The sample schedule for a Law and Society Major is designed to give students an idea of how to progress in a timely manner through their degree requirements. It is important to note JLS-101 and either JLS-110 or JLS-202 must be taken before any other JLS Department courses can be taken. For those choosing the Social Science Concentration JLS-280 must be taken prior to taking any classes within that concentration. Therefore it is recommended students take these courses within their first two semesters at AU. The following sample will give you an idea of how to plan the course of your studies over the next four years.
