Major Descriptions:

Interdisciplinary Studies- Communication, Legal Institutions, Economics, & Government (CLEG) Offered by the Department of Government, School of Public Affairs, this interdisciplinary major is designed for students who want a breadth of background necessary to participate effectively in decision making for public affairs and the practical training necessary to deal with social problems as public issues.

Justice & Law
