

The PMF Program

- Premier program for leadership development in the Federal civil service
- Provides two-year Federal Government fellowships to graduate students from all academic disciplines who expect to complete an advanced degree (master's, law, or doctoral-level degree) from a qualifying college or university during the current academic year



PMF Opportunities

- Two-year, paid full-time position with accelerated promotion potential
- Appointed at the GS-9, 11, or 12 (or equivalent), based on applicant qualifications and agency needs
- Promotion potential up to the GS-13
- Typical career path:
 - Appointment GS-9, step 1 (or equivalent)
 - 1-year anniversary eligible for GS-11, step 1
 - Program completion eligible for GS-12, step 1

Graduate students from all academic disciplines who expect to complete an advanced degree (master's, law, or doctoral-level degree) from a qualifying* college or university during the 2008-2009 academic year (September 1, 2008 - August 31, 2009) are eligible to apply




^{*} Generally, the institution must be accredited by an accrediting body recognized by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Education or must have acquired "pre-accreditation" or "candidate for accreditation status" recognized by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Education



- 2009 PMF Application open period:
 Wednesday, October 1 Wednesday, October 15, 2008
- Applicants complete an online application, link a USAJOBS resume, and submit a nomination form to their Nomination Official
 - Applicants apply online using USAJOBS at <u>www.USAJOBS.gov</u> or via a link from the PMF website's "How To Apply\PMF Application" <u>https://www.pmf.opm.gov/HApplication.aspx</u>
 - Applicants should confirm the school's process and deadlines for nomination into the PMF Program





- Applicants are nominated by the school's Dean, Chairperson, or Academic Program Director of their graduate program (Nomination Official)
- Schools conduct a competitive process to nominate the best candidates, which covers applicants':
 - Breadth and quality of accomplishments
 - Capacity for leadership
 - Commitment to excellence in leading and managing public policies and programs





- All nominees will be invited to participate in a structured and proctored assessment process
- Assessment centers will be available nationwide to accommodate nominees across the country
- Nominees are evaluated on:
 - Critical Thinking
 - Written Communication
 - Life Experiences
- Based on assessment scores and any adjudicated veterans' preference, nominees are selected as Finalists



Skills Assessed

Critical Thinking

Assesses problem solving and critical thinking skills

Life Experiences

Assesses selected leadership and interpersonal skills

Writing Fundamentals

Assesses writing ability





- Finalists are invited to attend a PMF Job Fair in the spring, attended by participating Federal agencies
- Finalists have access to an online PMF Projected Positions System (PPS) to identify agency positions
- Finalists have 12 months from the date they are selected to be appointed to agency positions



Key Dates*

- Online application available Wednesday, October 1, 2008
- Students submit online applications by Wednesday, October 15, 2008
- Nomination Officials submit nominations by Friday, October 31, 2008
- Nominees complete assessments in January 2009
- Nominees notified of their selection as Finalists by late-February to mid-March 2009
- Job Fair in the spring 2009
- Agencies hire Finalists over one full year from selection as a Finalist
