

Dr. Peter Howard is Director of Pre-College Programs and a faculty member in the School of International Service. He regularly teaches freshmen in the Introduction to World Politics course, undergraduates in Analysis of U.S. Foreign Policy, and serves as both instructor and faculty coordinator for Introduction to International Relations Research. Professor Howard recently developed a new Senior Seminar entitled Hegemony and U.S. Foreign Policy in the 21st Century. He is an active participant in the University Honors program, and regularly supervises internships and senior theses. He teaches graduate-level National Security Policy and Introduction to International Relations Theory and supervises graduate internships, theses, and capstone papers.

Professor Howard's research examines issues of international security, with a focus on U.S. Foreign Policy. Dr. Howard conducted research in Estonia, where he studied the implementation and effects of U.S. military engagement programs and NATO expansion, and South Korea, where he studied nuclear negotiations with North Korea, and Washington D.C., where he has studied U.S. foreign policy decision-making. He has published articles in *International Studies Quarterly*, *International Studies Perspectives*, and *Public Opinion Quarterly*.
