

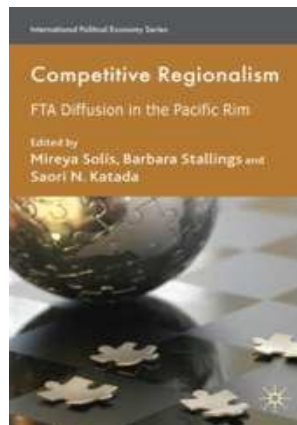
Dr. Mireya Solís (Harvard Ph.D., 1998) is Associate Professor at the School of International Service of American University. Her research interests include international and comparative political economy, Japanese politics and foreign policy, and regional integration in East Asia and North America. Dr. Solís authored *Banking on Multinationals: Public Credit and the Export of Japanese Sunset Industries* (Stanford University Press), and is co-editor of *Cross-Regional Trade Agreements: Understanding Fragmented Regionalism in East Asia* (Springer, 2008), and *Competitive Regionalism: Explaining the Diffusion and Implications of FTAs in the Pacific Rim* (Palgrave-Macmillan, forthcoming). Dr. Solís second single-authored book project "Trading Preferences? Japan's New Regionalism and East Asia" was awarded an Abe Fellowship by the Center for Global Partnership and the SSRC. Acting as principal investigator, Dr. Solís received a grant from CGP for the project *Competitive Regionalism: Strategic Dynamics of FTA Negotiation in East Asia and Beyond*. Dr. Solís has published articles in journals such as *International Studies Quarterly*, *Review of International Political Economy*, *The World Economy*, *Pacific Affairs*, *Business and Politics*, *Journal of East Asian Studies*, and *Asian Economic Policy Review*, as well as several book chapters. Dr. Solís has received numerous prizes and academic distinctions, including the Young Scholar Award from the Association of Japanese Business Studies, Fulbright and Ford Foundation scholarships, and fellowships from the Institute of Advanced Studies of the United Nations University in Tokyo, the Center for U.S.-Mexican Studies at the UCSD, and the U.S.-Japan Relations Program at Harvard University.
