It cannot have been easy working virtually at this most critical time in your students' secondary years. Thank you for your guidance to help them prepare for the next step in their lives—choosing a positive academic environment in which to grow as global citizens. This fall 2021, we're excited to welcome to campus over 120 international and U.S. "Global Nomad" first-year students from 58 countries of residence around the world and 9 U.S. states. Many of these students are from your schools or regions. We welcome students who are pursuing a rigorous and challenging secondary school curriculum, who have strong academic credentials, excellent communication skills, resilience, adaptability, and who are committed to making a difference in today's world through leadership and community service.

IAP Non-degree Pathway Program: The <u>International Accelerator Program (IAP)</u>, combines intensive English language instruction with coursework and supplemental support resources to help fully integrate students into AU and our campus community.

Our 2021 incoming freshman class:

- Nearly 20,000 applications for fall 2021.
- 3.81 average GPA equivalent for admitted freshmen.

Outcomes:

- 90 percent of our students pursue one or more internships during their undergraduate study at AU.
- 91 percent of our 2020 alumni were working and/or in graduate school within six months of graduation.

Program offerings:

- New! AU Cornerstone only opportunity for AU first-year students to do study abroad or do an internship
- Nearly 70 programs in the arts, sciences, humanities, business, international studies, public affairs, social sciences, education, communication, or pre-professional programs in law and medicine
- Interdisciplinary approach allows students to construct their own majors
- 50+ combined five-year bachelor's/master's programs, 3-year bachelor's degree programs include Global Scholars; Politics, Policy, and Law; and Public Health
- Sakura Scholars joint degree program with Ritsumeikan University in Kyoto, Japan

A completed application packet for F or I students applying from high schools inside the U.S. must include:

- Common Application or Coalition Application. (U.S.\$75 fee)
- International students graduating high school **inside the U.S.** may choose to apply Test Optional and **not** submit SAT/ACT scores, especially if they arrived at your school after 9th grade.
- Proof of English proficiency is required. We have expanded our English proficiency options. TOEFL, IELTS, Duolingo English Test (DET), PTE, or Cambridge Assessment English can be used to meet AU's English proficiency requirement.





• F or J visa students must submit the AU Certification of Finances form and a bank letter showing a minimum of U.S. \$70,464 (2022 estimated costs) for their first year of study **before** their application packets can be reviewed and considered for admission.

Financing an AU Education:

- Partial merit scholarships are available but very competitive. 2021 amounts ranged from \$8,000-\$20,000/year.
- Only U.S. citizens/U.S. permanent residents are eligible to apply for need-based financial aid. Eligible students should submit the FAFSA and CSS Profile by their selected admissions application deadline.
- We received over 100 applications for our 2021 AU Emerging Global Leader Scholarship (AU EGLS). Awarded to one international student each year, the AU EGLS covers all costs that are billable to AU. Recipients must be prepared to prove ability to pay US\$4,000/per year for non-billable mandatory expenses. Students must complete a separate application in addition to the Common or Coalition application and submit additional essays.
- We have resources on financial planning tips and advice for <u>prospective</u> and <u>admitted</u> students from outside the U.S.

At AU, we learn, research, and work to spark positive change in our neighborhood and world. We look forward to welcoming your students to AU and to working together throughout the coming year to ensure a smooth transition into our dynamic and vibrant academic environment.
