## **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

#### Singularity (sing-gyuh-LAR-i-tee).

Definition: a trait marking one as distinct from others; strangeness by virtue of being remarkable or unusual; a peculiarity. Used in a Sentence: If you want friends, avoid singularity.

#### Alienation (eyl-yuh-NEY-shuhn)

Definition: the state of being an outsider or the feeling of being isolated, as from society; disassociation; estrangement. Used in a Sentence: Special people should expect alienation.

### Projection (pruh-JEK-shuhn)

Definition: a prediction or an estimate of something in the future; the attribution of one's own attitudes, feelings, or desires to someone or something as a naive or unconscious defense against anxiety or guilt. Used in a Sentence: Little Wally, our need for you to become a doctor isn't projection; we just want what's best for you.

#### Community (kuh-MYOO-ni-tee)

Definition: a group of people having cultural, religious, ethnic, or other characteristics in common; similarity or agreement. Used in a Sentence: While you may choose your community, you are stuck with your family.

This play is populated with the intelligent, the talented, the odd. This singularity too often makes the characters feel freakish and alone. Children (adults, too) most often want to fit in, to be like everyone else. We all experience this sense of alienation and isolation. The projection of parents, peers, and institutions creates enormous pressure to achieve "success," often leading us to do what we think we should, rather than what brings us happiness. If we are lucky, however, we encounter a like-minded community of family and friends that share our quirks – people who love us in spite of (or maybe even because of) our singularity.

I first directed this musical at AU in 2012. This production marks the only time I've directed a production here more than once. In early 2012, my son was two. Now, he is 12 – the age of the characters inhabiting this play. So, I understand these kids differently now. I love them more, or at least differently. I feel an even greater desire to protect them. And the increased rage, discord, and volatility of the world in which we now live makes this musical's message of love and empathy that much more important.

The National Spelling Bee (now known as Scripps National Spelling Bee) began in 1925. Millions of children, ages 8-14, participate in local spelling bees each year from the United States, Europe, Canada, New Zealand, Guam, Jamaica, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and American Samoa. Roughly 250 regional winners compete in the nationally televised finals.

## **THE FARM**

**The Farm** was founded in 2000 by Rebecca Feldman, Artistic Director. It is a collective of writers and performers, including Jay Reiss, Dan Fogler, and Sarah Saltzberg. The Farm's interest is in the role of improvisation in creating new work for the theatre. The Farm initially designates a two-week intensive period in which to discover, develop, and rehearse a play from the impulses borne mainly out of the pressure of a deadline. Previous projects include *Super* (at Atlantic Theatre Studios), *Why I Hate Florida* (workshop at White Wave in DUMBO) and *C-R-E-P-U-S-C-U-L-E* (at the Present Company Theatorium in October 2002), on which *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee* is based. The character and original dialogue of "Beth Marguiles," "Vice President Douglas Panch," "Mr. Barfee," and "Logan Schwarzengrubenierre" were created by Rebecca Feldman, Jay Reiss, Dan Fogler, and Sarah Saltzberg, respectively.
