Learning Together in Fall 2020

To our students: As American University moves toward a blended inperson and online learning community in Fall 2020, the five programs that comprise the Department of Performing Arts – Arts Management, Audio Technology, Dance, Music, and Theatre / Musical Theatre – are committed to a dynamic, connected, expressive, and fulfilling experience for all of our majors, minors, and participating students.

We are working together to rethink and adapt our Fall 2020 courses to meet these goals online, in-person, and in blended settings. All of this work will be informed by the "Guiding Values" listed here. We invite you to join us as full partners on this journey.

We are particularly focused on courses that conventionally require groups of students working intensively and collectively in shared space, such as productions, performances, ensembles, studios, seminars, hands-on projects, and a range of other experiences. For this work, we plan to integrate and innovate across four modes of practice, performance, and production:

Asynchronous

This involves group performance and production assembled from individually recorded performances – like the "virtual choirs" vou've seen online.

Synchronous

This involves real-time, interactive work from remote locations. We are exploring a series of online services and systems that allow this close creative collaboration, even from afar.

Physically Distanced

When we do gather in shared space, we will use technologies that support real-time, artistic creation that ensure appropriate physical distance. Individual "kits" of microphones, headphones, and production technology will allow students, faculty, and guests to work together while standing apart.

Blended

We also imagine a wide range of evolving art forms and creative practices that combine the components above – with recorded and live expression seamlessly intertwining into a single experience online or in person.

Each of your faculty is working to integrate these tools into their ensembles, productions, performances, and group learning courses. We and they will be sharing these plans with you as Fall approaches. We welcome your questions and ideas. And we're excited to join with you to understand, imagine, and enact the future of the performing arts.
