College and Career Professional Competencies

The Center for Postsecondary Readiness and Success will begin conducting focus groups with K-12 school counselors and college access professionals to review and share feedback on the College and Career Professional Competencies. CPRS has identified the following focus group locations: Baltimore, MD., Boca Raton, Fl., Chicago, Il., San Francisco, CA., and Washington DC.. The center is also working with NCAN to host a virtual focus group. Raise DC and DC-CAP High School to College Transition

CPRS partnered with Raise DC (college access non-profit) and the DC College Access Program (DC-CAP) on their Summer Melt Texting intervention by providing virtual advising support to 2700 rising DC college freshman and 800 rising DC college sophomores. The goal was to increase the number of DC students transitioning to college from high school and college freshman to their sophomore year. AU graduate students replied via text message to DC student responses to the automated text messages and offered personalized support regarding the key tasks students must complete to remain on track for fall matriculation. They also provided support and information about the DC Tuition Assistance Grant (DC-TAG) and the Last Dollar Scholarship.

Upon completion of the summer project, CPRS continued ongoing support to the current college freshman class. Dr. Owen and her students continued to support the students throughout their sophomore year of college and the summer transition to their junior year of college which ended this past September (2019). Dr. Owen is currently working on a paper outlining the lessons learned and Jasmine Byrd, CPRS research assistant, will present the findings at the **American Educational Research Association** (AERA) in San Francisco (April 2020).

Community Based Research Scholars CBRS

CPRS partnered with CBRS to learn how DC students prefer to receive college and career information. AU students conducted student surveys and focus groups at four high schools in DC. and then analyzed the data and presented their findings to staff at all four schools. Dr. Owen and Dr. Jane Palmer, director of the CBRS program, are working on a joint paper regarding this collaborative work. Their paper will be presented at AERA in April 2020.
