Cybersecurity Startup Founders in Greater Washington, DC

Prior Experience Required

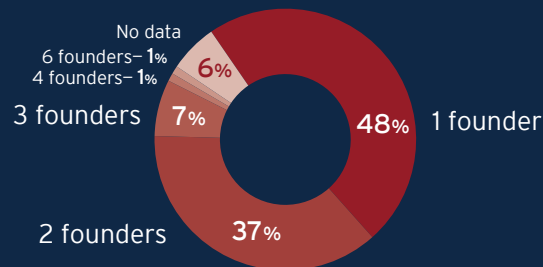
The Greater Washington region is one of three leading cybersecurity industry clusters in the world today. It seeds companies from a vast national security ecosystem consisting of government organizations and private vendors. This study examined the roots of the founders of pure-play cybersecurity.

Firms with at least one founder with some experience in the national security ecosystem—in either government or vendor company

This finding validates those who have argued, anecdotally, that there is a close connection between Greater Washington region cybersecurity startups and the national security ecosystem. It also distinguishes the region from competing cybersecurity clusters

We collected data on 177 pure-play cyber firms—and their founders—in the Washington D.C. metropolitan region (61% of the firms are in Northern Virginia and the rest in suburban Maryland and Washington, DC). In these firms, there are 264 founders.



More About the Founders and Their Cybersecurity Firms

Given the strong national security roots, it isn't surprising how local the talent pool is.
