
- IFC welcomed 125 new members into the community this year welcome!

<u>Imperative</u>: Provide a first-rate <u>STUDENT EXPERIENCE</u> that promotes access, thriving, retention, and graduation.

<u>FSL Goal:</u> To ensure the membership in a social fraternity or sorority helps retain students to graduation.

<u>In Progress.</u> FSL will work with reporting software to effectively display retention and graduation rates of our fraternity and sorority members.

Imperative: Lead and model **INCLUSIVE EXCELLENCE**.

<u>FSL Goal:</u> To incorporate cultural awareness, health and safety, and education within the community.

<u>In Progress.</u> FSL will highlight Diversity, Equity, an Inclusion in its New Member Series and Leadership Retreat.

<u>Imperative:</u> Improve **HOW AU WORKS** to cultivate a work environment that enables our faculty and staff to thrive.

<u>FSL Goal:</u> Evaluate Our Technology to be fully equipped to host and facilitate community and programming.

<u>In Progress.</u> Academic Year 2021-2022 will be a hybrid academic year, and FSL will work to help provide community and opportunities to manage both in-person and virtual events, meetings, and opportunities.

2021-2022 FSL CHALLENGES & LIMITATIONS

This past year, American University, with the rest of country, faced the return to campus in a hybrid and adjusting climate. Due to this, FSL experienced setbacks and challenges related to its operation. Some of those impacts are:

- Impacted chapter numbers resulting from the virtual only term of 2020-2021
- Impacted student engagement with both Council and Chapter Leadership
- Reemergence of an Abolish Greek Life Community that presented multiple protests in The Bridge, 1 FSL Focused Eagle Article, and FSL focused referenda in the Student Government Elections.

2021-2022 FSL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Paths Integration FSL implemented Paths to help students better track their progress within the New Member Series.
- Finance Process CSI's Finance Team and FSL established a clear and strong process for issuing invoices and collecting dues from chapters.
- Event Submission COVID-19 helped to create a more streamlined submission and review process for chapters to submit.
- Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Facilitated conversations with Chapter and Council Leaders on historical biases within FSL and solutions to remove the biases.

Goal #1: FSL is working on creating an Emerging Leaders Program to help the newest and upcoming future leaders within FSL become leaders within the community as well as gain their own leadership skills.
