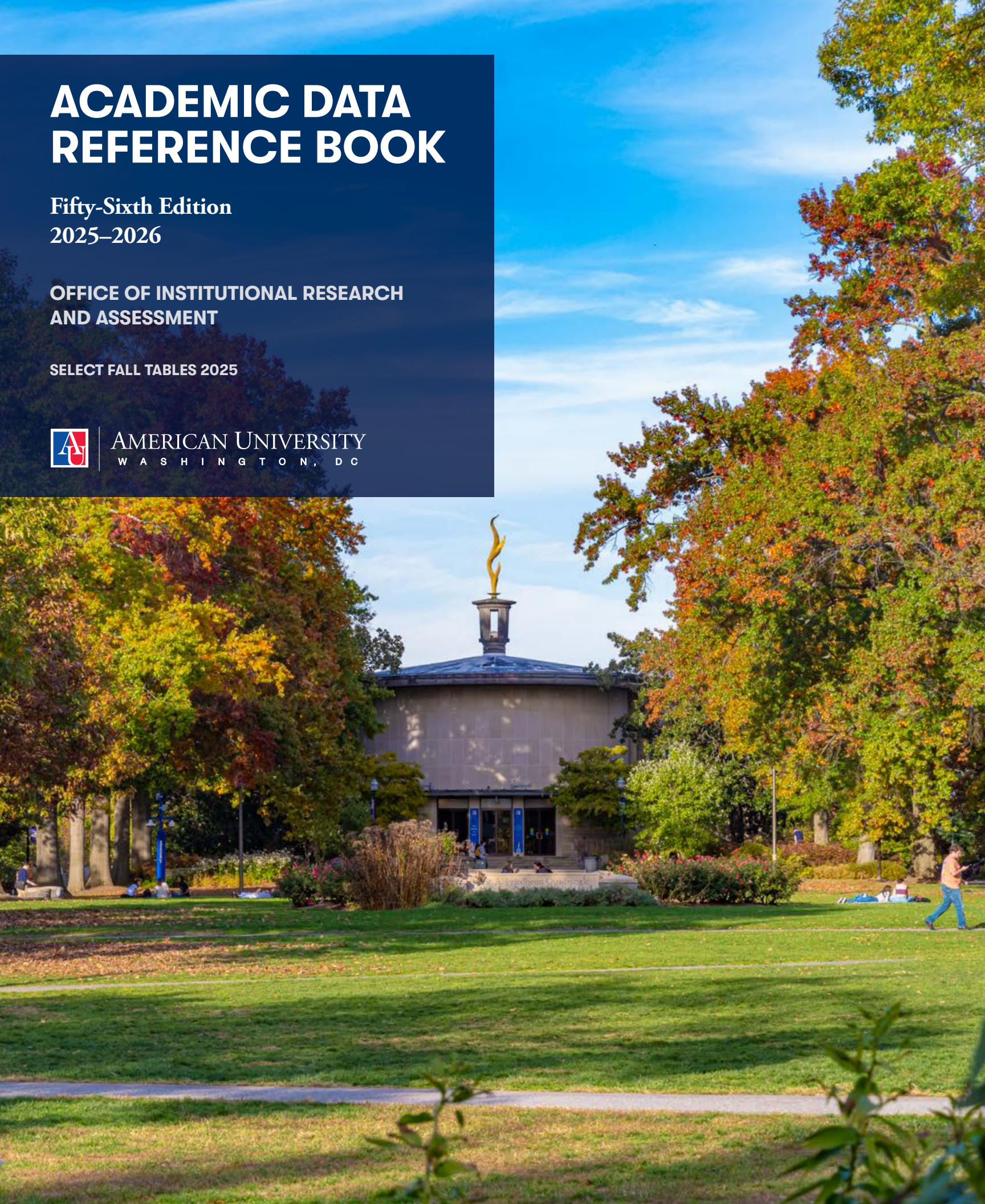

# ADRB DEFINITIONS

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<b>Abroad at AU</b>	A program for students from other countries who want to study at AU for a limited period, usually a year or a semester. Abroad at AU students are nondegree.
<b>Accelerator</b>	An AU-Shorelight Education partnership, consisting of Undergraduate Accelerator (pre-bachelor's) and Master's Accelerator (pre-master's) designed for international students. These programs combine English-language support and some for-credit courses transferable to an AU degree-seeking program upon successful completion. This program started in Fall 2016. Some students enroll in a noncredit Pre-Sessional English program prior to commencing an AU Accelerator program.
<b>Adjunct Faculty</b>	A part-time, non-tenure-line AU employee hired for a faculty position whose primary role is teaching.
<b>Adjusted Cohort</b>	A subset of an entering cohort with students removed based on allowable exclusions per NCES guidelines, such as no-shows, deaths, religious missions, or military service. Entering cohort counts at census—rather than adjusted cohort counts—are used elsewhere in AU's internal dashboards and reports and therefore may differ from data in ADRB Section 3 tables.
<b>Census Date</b>	The date AU takes a snapshot of student data to ensure consistent reporting for each semester. For fall and spring semesters, it is the end of the sixth week of classes. The summer census date is July 15. All admission and enrollment data in the ADRB are as of census dates.
<b>Class Standing</b>	Class Standing is the classification of the student that is determined by the total number of credits that the student has earned after a given semester. Class Standing is not by entering academic term. First-year standing is less than 30 credit hours; sophomore standing is 30-59 credit hours; junior standing is 60-89 credit hours; senior standing is 90 credit hours or above. Credits in progress are excluded.

<b>Cohort/Entering Cohort</b>	A group of students who enter the institution at the same degree level in the same term and who maintain registration as of the census date. Entering cohorts, also referred to as cohorts, are used in reporting graduation and retention rates of special academic and co-curricular programs, such as living-learning communities (LLCs), three-year bachelor's degree programs, self-identified first-generation college students, invite-only Summer Transition Enrichment Program (STEP) participants, and Pell grant recipients.
<b>Collegiate</b>	Launched in Fall 2017, American Collegiate (formerly American Access) is an AU-Shorelight Education partnership program for international students. Its nondegree design combines English-language support and some for-credit courses, which are transferable to a bachelor's degree program at a partner or affiliated university (including AU) upon successful completion of program requirements.
<b>Credit</b>	A credit course is one that, if successfully completed, can be applied toward the number of credits required to achieve a degree, diploma, or other recognized postsecondary credential.
<b>Degrees Conferred</b>	The total number of degrees (or certificates) granted to students upon completion of their program requirements, which may exceed the number of graduates if students earn multiple degrees (or certificates).
<b>Faculty Rank</b>	Academic rank, sometimes referred to as title, is the consolidated categories of professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, and lecturer, which align with AAUP and federal reporting requirements, and which appear in ADRB Tables 6-1 and 6-2. Other faculty ranks, such as in-residence, library and research faculty, appear in ADRB Tables 6-3 and 6-4.
<b>Faculty Tenure Type</b>	Designation of faculty appointment status as tenure-line or non-tenured-line for full-time faculty. Tenure-line includes tenured and tenure track, and non-tenure-line includes term and continuing.

<b>Faculty Type</b>	Classification of faculty status as Teaching, Administrative, or Other, which may refer to tenure-line or non-tenured-line faculty. Teaching faculty are AAUP-defined. Administrative faculty, not reported to AAUP, include positions such as president, provost, deans, and associate deans. Other faculty, not reported to AAUP, includes research faculty/post-doctoral fellows, librarians, and faculty on leave without pay/medical-related leave.
<b>First Generation</b>	Status determined by responses to questions on the admissions application regarding parents'/legal guardians' education. Students who self-report that neither parent/legal guardian has completed a bachelor's degree are classified as first generation.
<b>First-Year</b>	A first-time, first-year undergraduate student admitted to AU who has not previously been enrolled at the undergraduate level at any institution.
<b>Full-Time Equivalent (FTE)</b>	An alternative method to headcount for counting student enrollment by which the number of full-time students plus the total student credit hours of part-time students is divided by the minimum number of credits to be considered a full-time student at the same academic level. Thus, students attending full-time or part-time are weighted. (Note: Calculation method changed in 2009; use caution with historical comparisons.)
<b>Full-Time Faculty</b>	An AU employee hired full-time in a faculty position. Full-time faculty are categorized by primary responsibilities outlined in their contract, which may include teaching, administration, library services, or research.
<b>Full-Time Staff</b>	An AU employee hired full-time in a position whose primary responsibility does not involve teaching.
<b>Full-Time Student</b>	Status based on minimum student term credit hour load: undergraduate degree-seeking, nondegree, and certificate students—12+ credit hours in fall/spring or summer sessions; graduate degree-seeking, nondegree and certificate students—9+ credit hours in fall/spring or 4+ credit hours in summer sessions; law students—12+ credit hours in fall/spring or 6+ credit hours during summer sessions.

<b>Full-Time Teaching Faculty</b>	Full-time faculty whose primary responsibility, as defined in their contract, is teaching, with additional responsibilities that may include scholarly research, creative works, service, or administration in smaller percentages.
<b>Gender</b>	ADRB gender definitions align with federal reporting requirements, allowing only binary gender values. Gender is self-reported as either women or men; if not reported, it is categorized as not reported. Each person is counted in only one category. AU students, staff, and faculty may designate their pronouns and/or gender identity, so gender data reported in AU's internal dashboards and reports may differ from data reported here.
<b>Graduation Rate</b>	The ratio of students in an entering cohort, as of the census of their entering semester (minus any allowable exclusions), who have graduated within a specified number of years.
<b>Headcount</b>	A number of people (count) in a defined group. For enrollment, each full-time or part-time student is counted once. Unless otherwise specified in the ADRB, headcount is unduplicated, counting each student once by their first major and highest degree.
<b>International</b>	A non-U.S. citizen in the U.S. on a temporary basis, has a visa, and is not a permanent resident.
<b>Intersession</b>	Beginning in AY 2021–22, AU added a nonstandard winter intersession term covering a 2-3-week period between fall and spring semesters. Winter intersession enrollments are captured under the fall semester.
<b>Law</b>	As of the AY 2024–25 ADRB, this category includes only degree-seeking law students in WCL (JD, LLM, MLS, and SJD). Nondegree and certificate law students are categorized separately. Previously, all law students—degree-seeking, non-degree, and certificate—were grouped together.
<b>Level</b>	Also referred to as academic or degree level, this classification reflects a student's educational level based on their academic program. Students may be classified at the broad levels of undergraduate (UG) and graduate (GR) or more specifically as bachelor's, master's, doctoral, law, nondegree and certificate. In the ADRB, we further delineate the levels by including categories for online, MM, JD, LLM, MLS, and SJD.

<b>Maintaining Matriculation</b>	One of three enrollment options for graduate students not enrolled in credit coursework but utilizing university services to maintain their enrollment. (The other options are continuing enrollment and doctoral dissertation enrollment.)
<b>MicroStrategy</b>	One of AU's business intelligence systems used for reporting AU data.
<b>Noncredit</b>	A noncredit course has no credit applicable toward a degree, diploma, certificate, or other recognized postsecondary credential. A program is a noncredit program if all required classes do not convey university credit.
<b>Nondegree</b>	An academic program of study that does not lead to a degree or certificate.
<b>Online Course</b>	A course in which instruction is delivered exclusively via a virtual instructional modality rather than face-to-face.
<b>Part-Time Student</b>	Student status that is derived by a student term credit hour load less than the minimum credit load required to be considered full-time: undergraduate degree-seeking, nondegree and certificate students—fewer than 12 credit hours in fall/spring or summer sessions; graduate degree-seeking, nondegree, and certificate students—fewer than 9 credit hours in fall/spring, or fewer than 4 credit hours during summer sessions; law students—fewer than 12 credit hours in fall/spring, or fewer than 6 credit hours during summer sessions.
<b>Pre-College Nondegree</b>	High school students enrolled in regular university courses who have not been admitted to a degree program or certificate program but are enrolled for credit prior to earning their high school diploma. Also referred to as dual enrollment. (Please see the term Accelerator for a definition of one of AU's pre-college programs.)

<b>Race/Ethnicity</b>	ADRB race/ethnicity definitions adhere to federal reporting requirements. Race/ethnicity is self-reported and categorized as: American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian, Black or African American, Hispanic/Latino, Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander, and White. Individuals who report two or more races without identifying as Hispanic/Latino are classified as multiracial. Non-U.S. citizens in the U.S. on a temporary visa, who are not permanent residents, are reported as international. Each person is counted in only one category. Race/ethnicity data in AU's internal dashboards and reports may use non-federal reporting categories and may differ from ADRB data.
<b>Retention</b>	Students in a cohort as of census of their entering term who are still enrolled at census of a later term.
<b>Retention Rate</b>	The ratio of students in an entering cohort, as of the census of their entering semester (minus any allowable exclusions), who have re-enrolled as of census of a subsequent term.
<b>School/College/Office</b>	This refers to a student's affiliation based on their primary program of enrollment or a faculty member's affiliation based on their contract.
<b>Second Major</b>	The secondary of two or more majors in the pursuit of a single degree.
<b>Student Credit Hours</b>	The sum of the credit hours per student course registration.
<b>Study Abroad (Non-AU)</b>	A program allowing non-AU students to study abroad through an AU-sponsored program.
<b>Transfer Student</b>	A student admitted to AU who is transferring credits into their AU program. If the transfer credits are from another institution, the student is classified as an external transfer; otherwise, the student is an internal transfer based on credits transferred from an AU nondegree status.
<b>T-Terms</b>	AU's 4-term programs used in select KOGOD, SIS, and WCL online graduate programs. T-Terms consist of four periods: January-March for T1, April-June for T2, July-September for T3, and October-December for T4. The first t-term at AU was 2019T2. The ADRB reports on T1, T3, and T4 beginning with 2019T3.

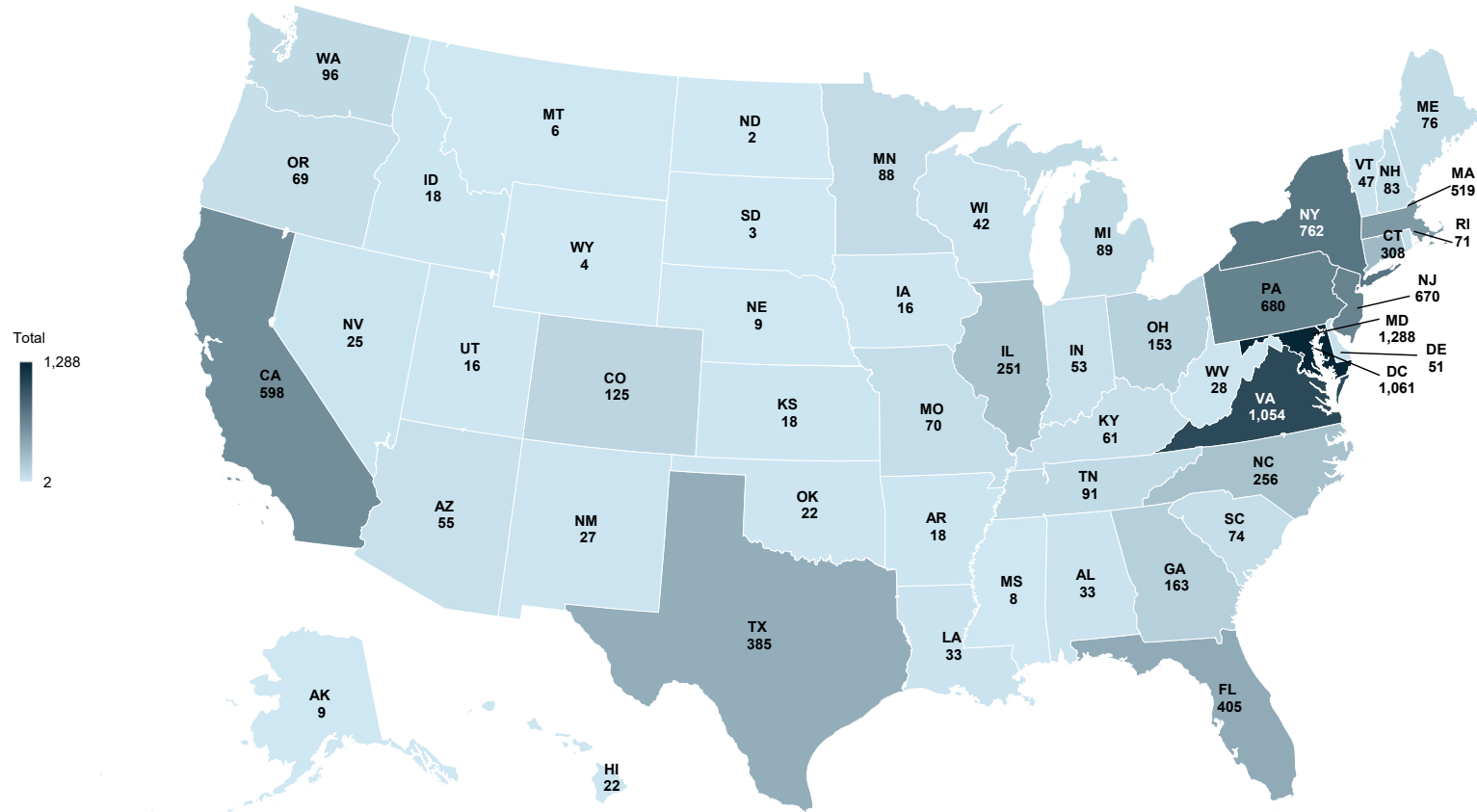

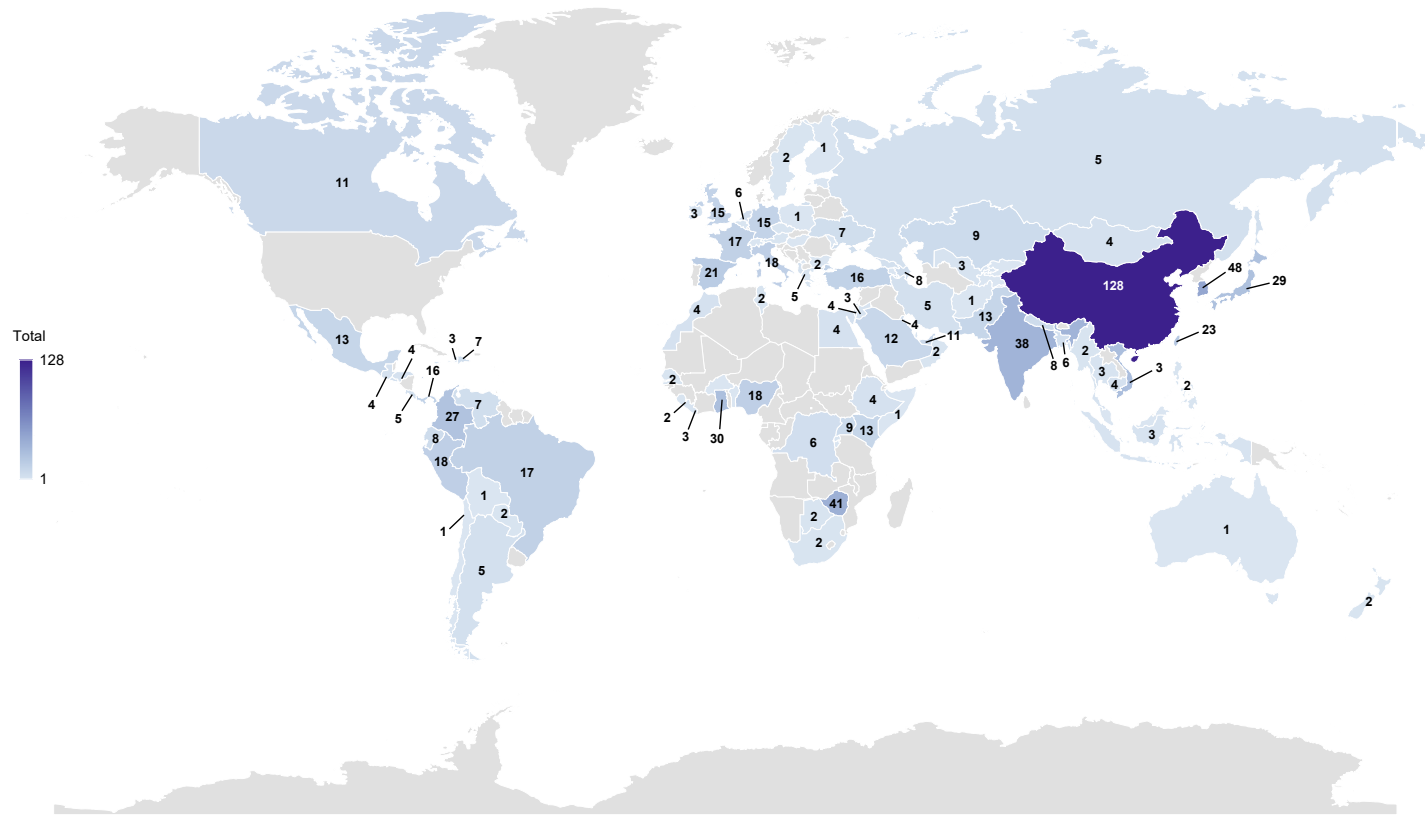

**Fall 2025**

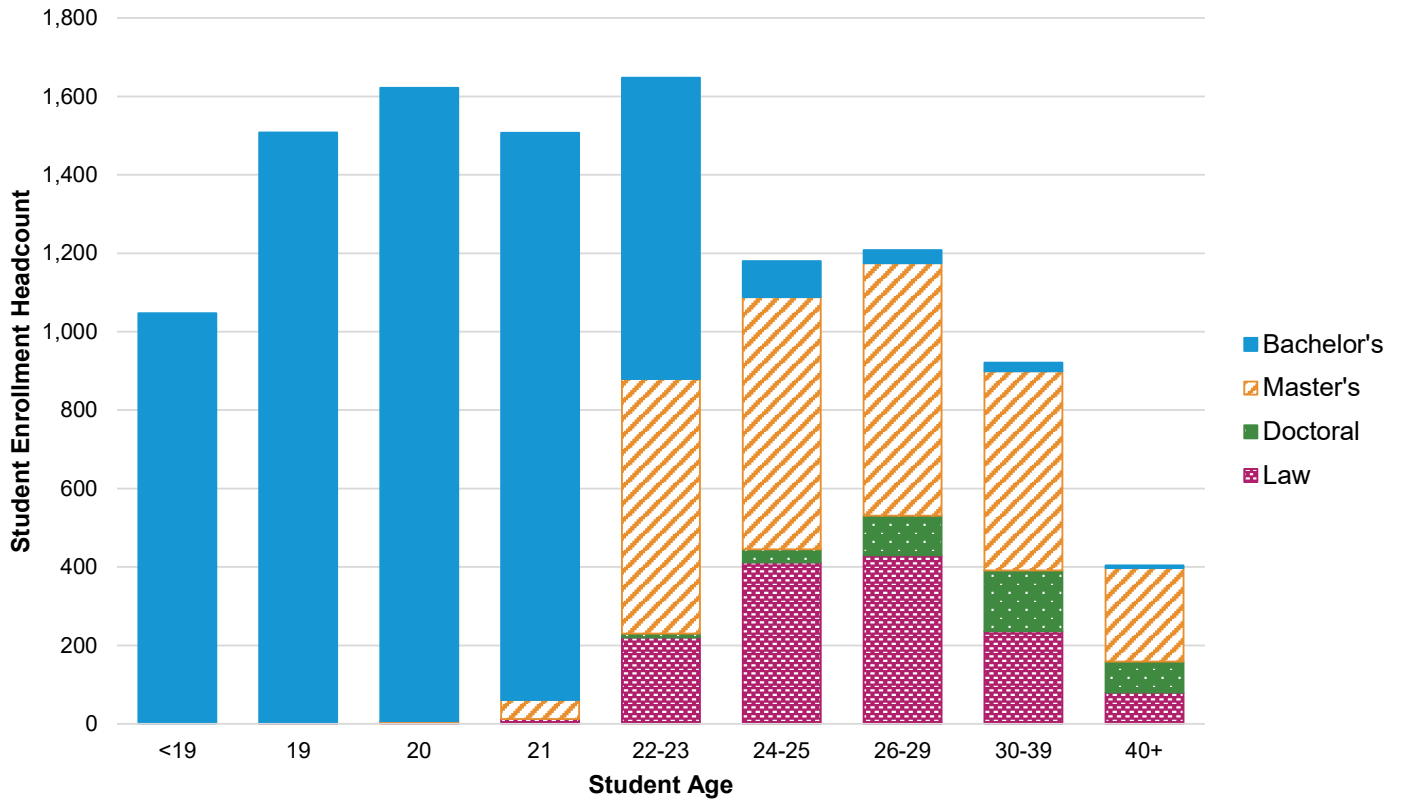

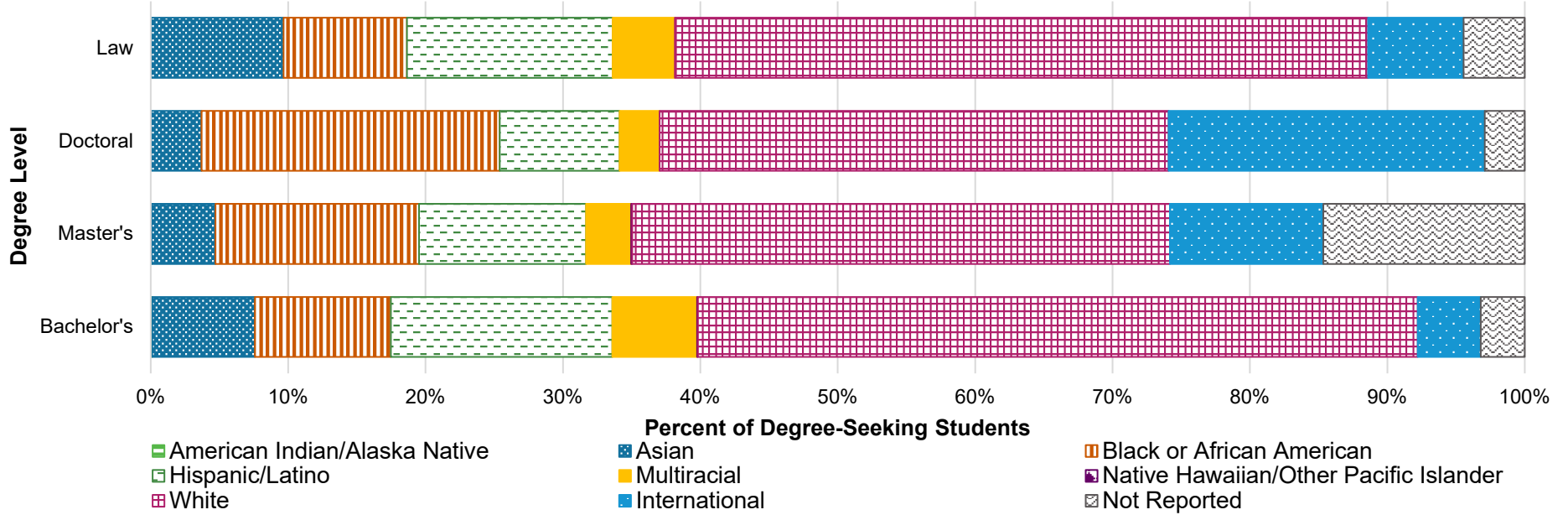

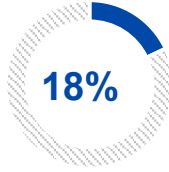
**Figure 2.9**

*(forthcoming)*



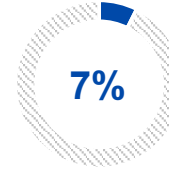

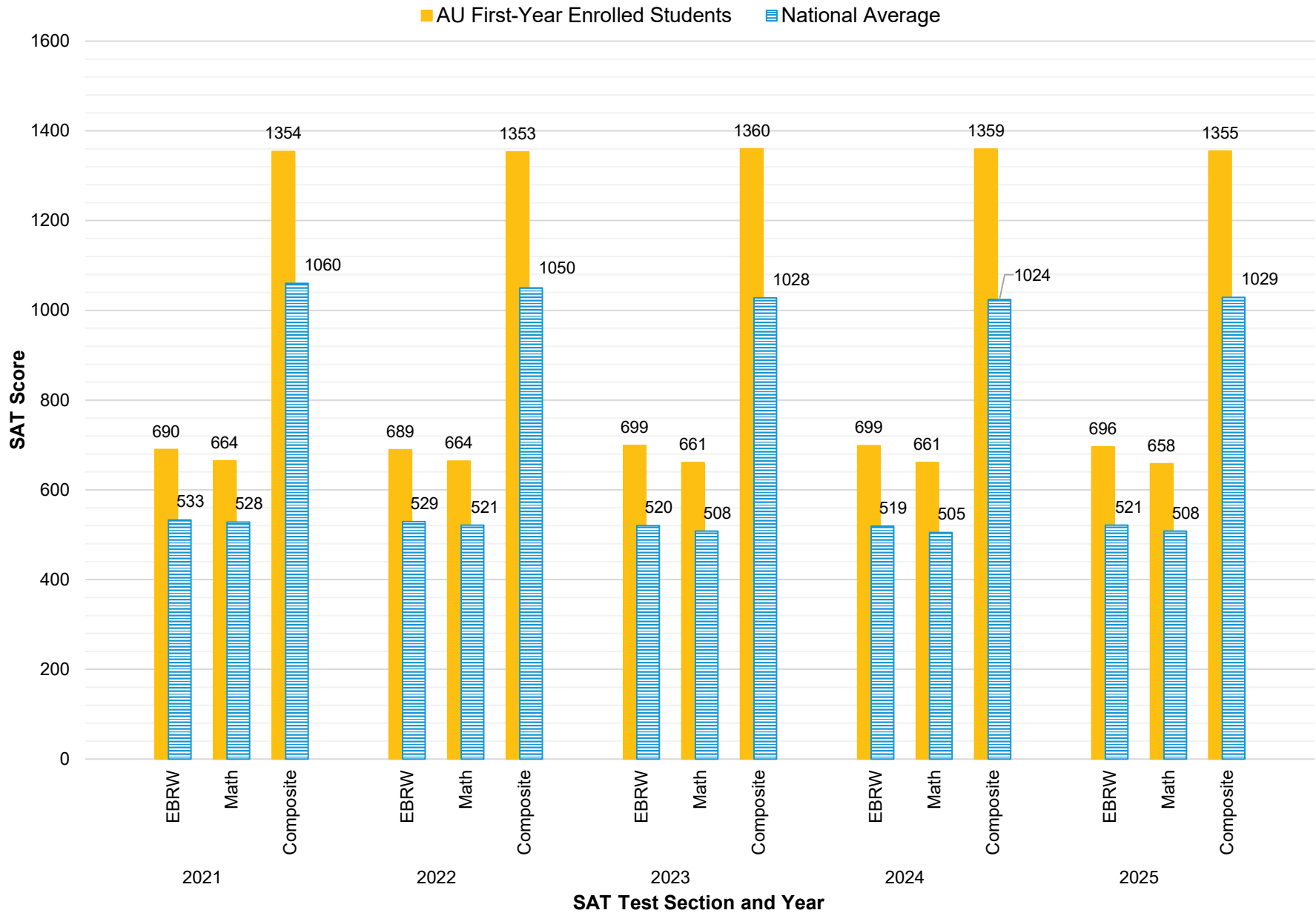

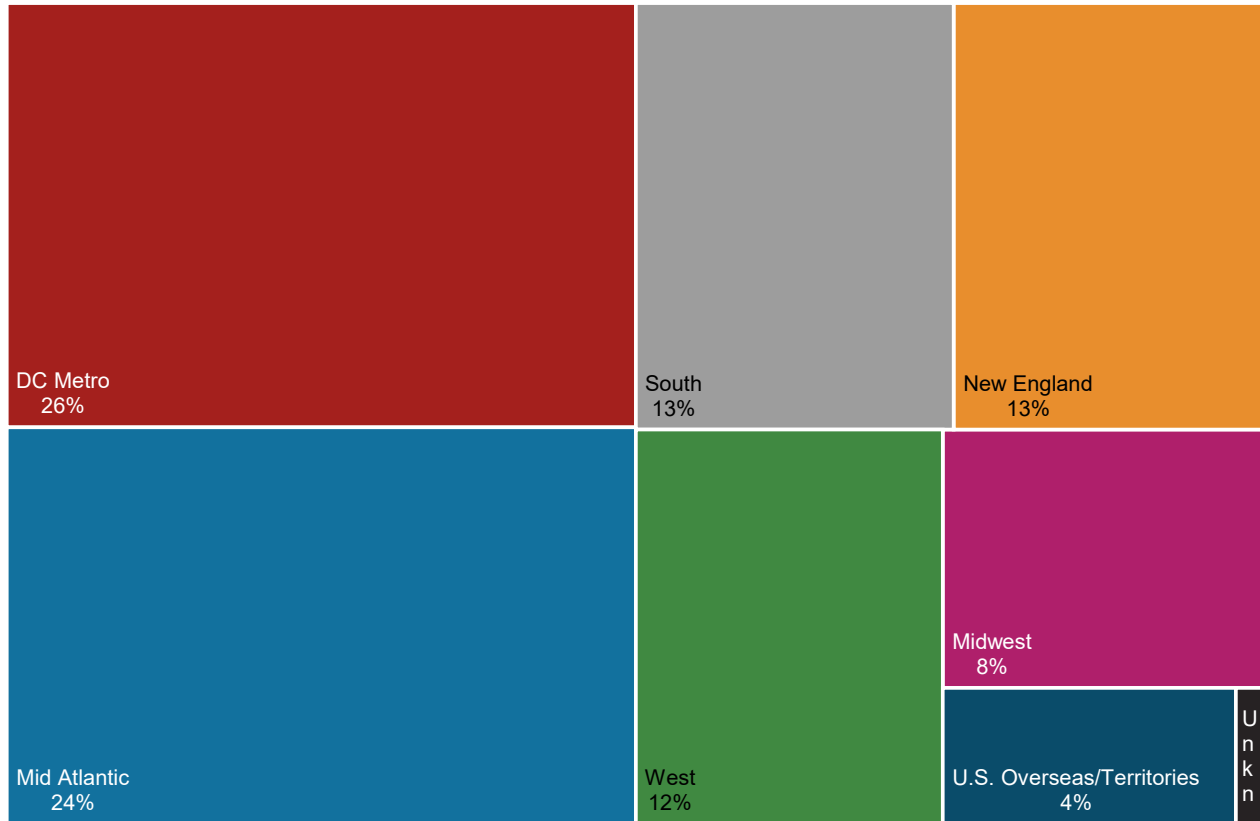

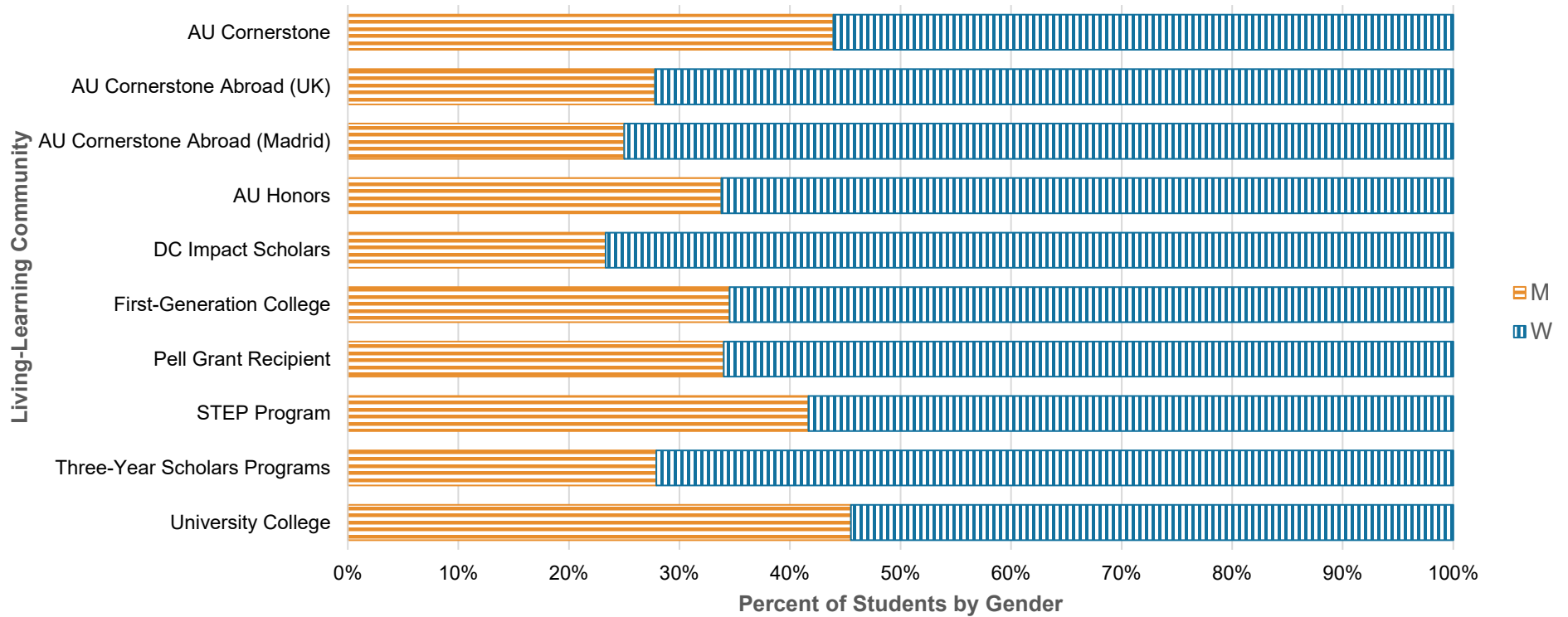

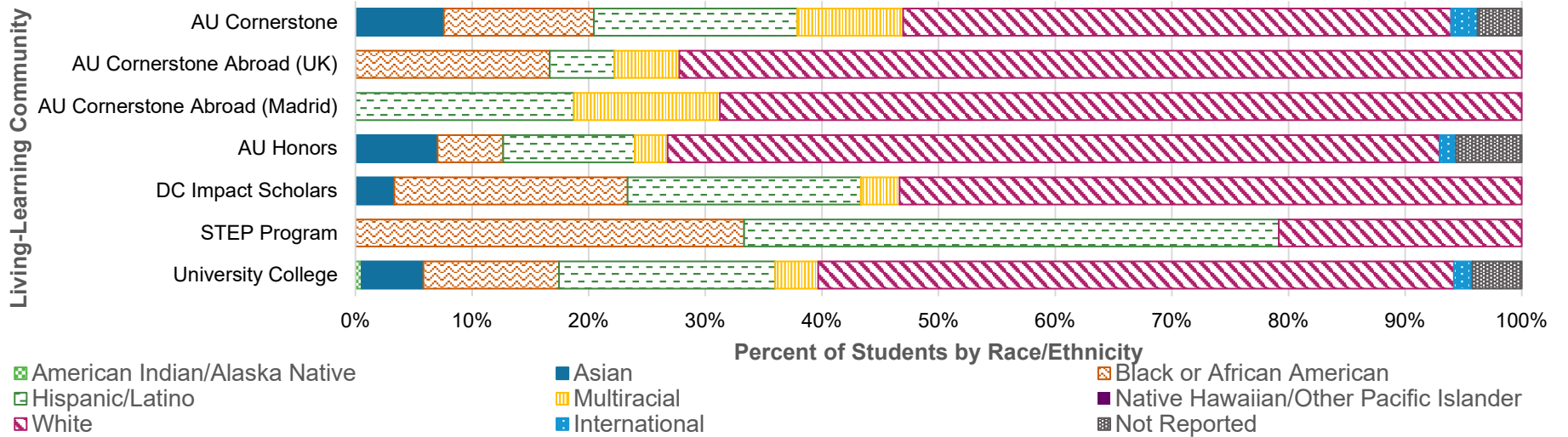
**Figure 2.2**

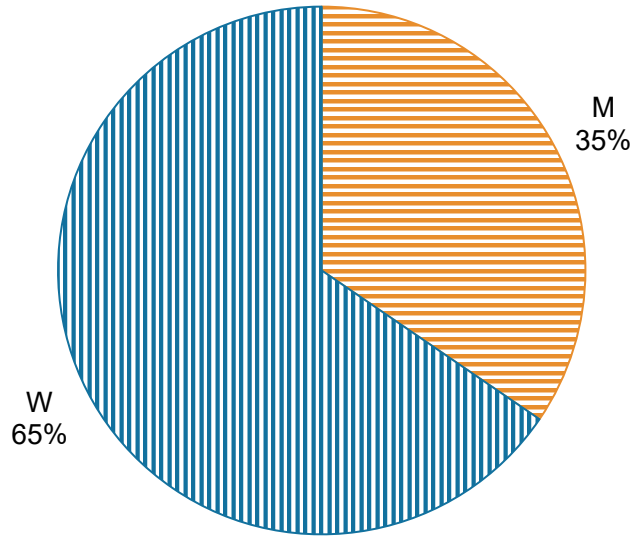
**Figure 2.3**

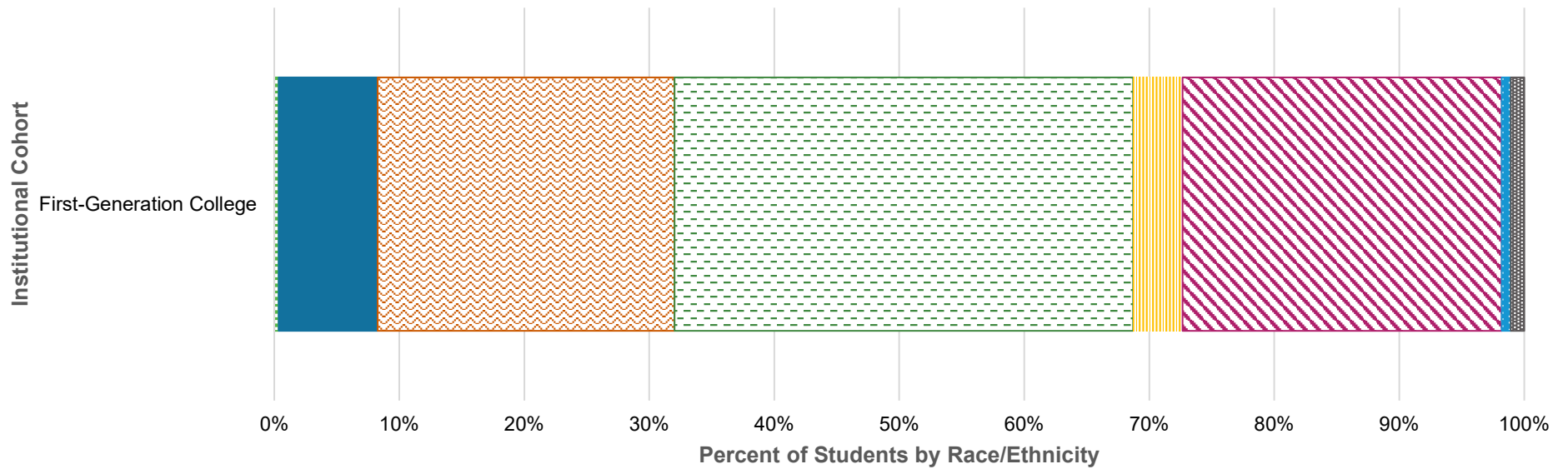

**Fall 2025**



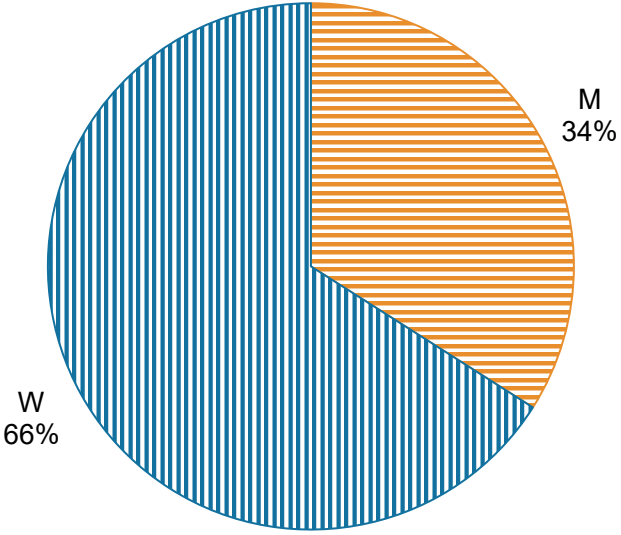

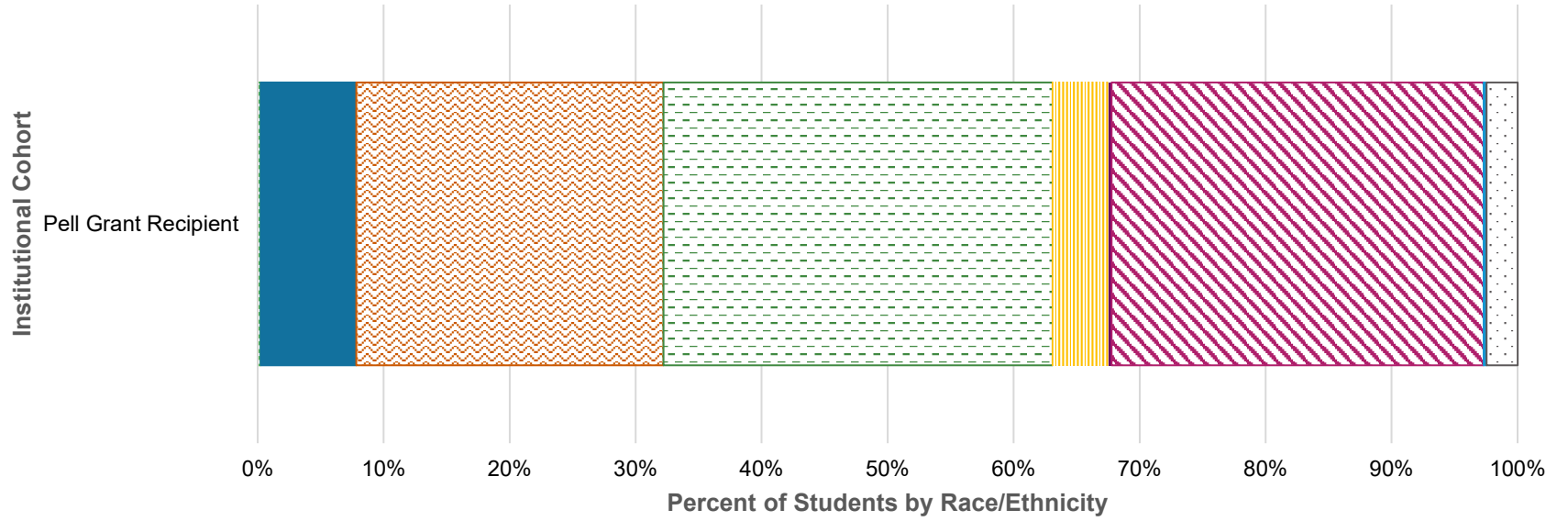

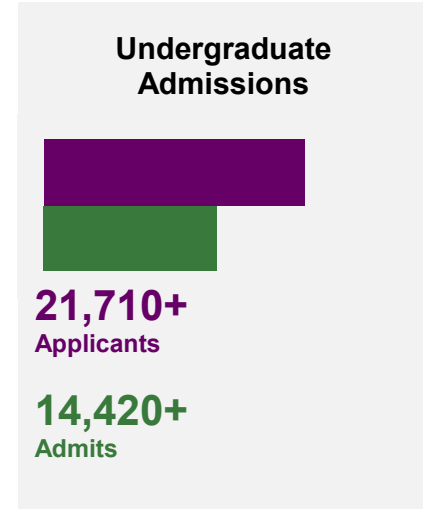

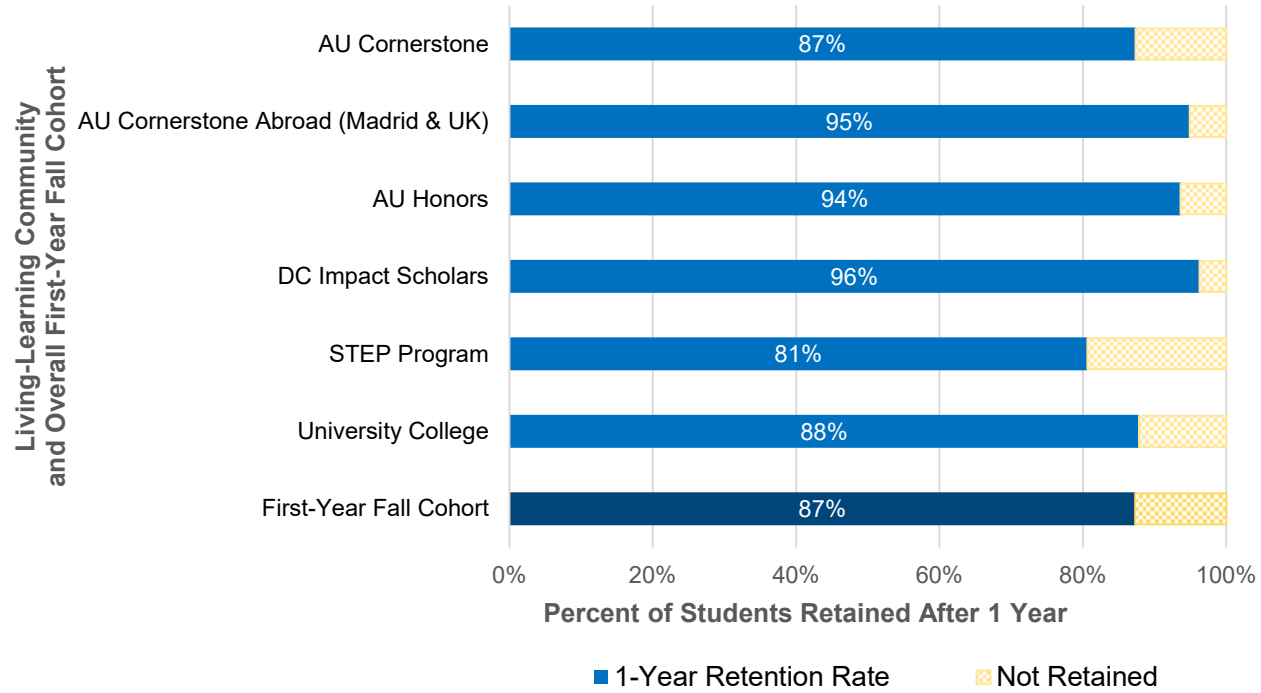

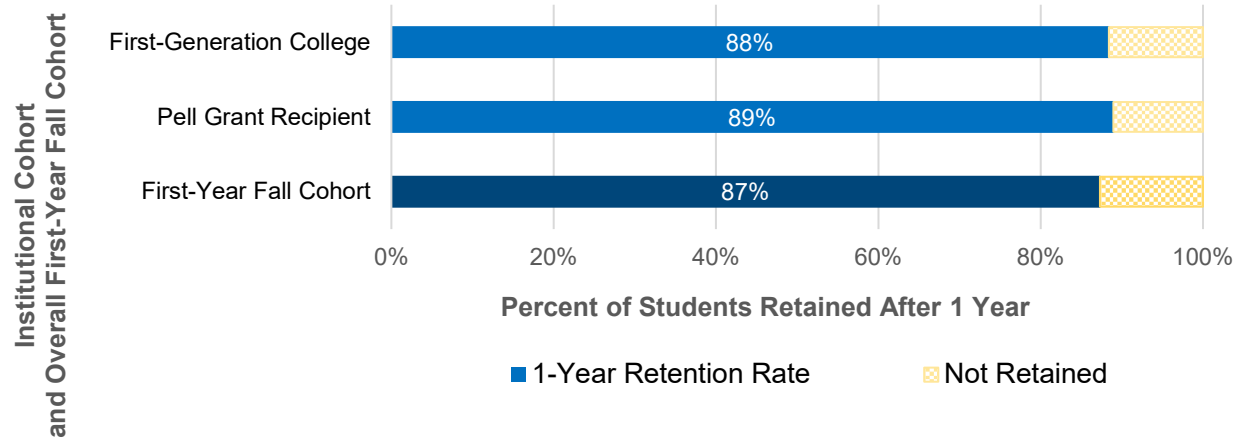

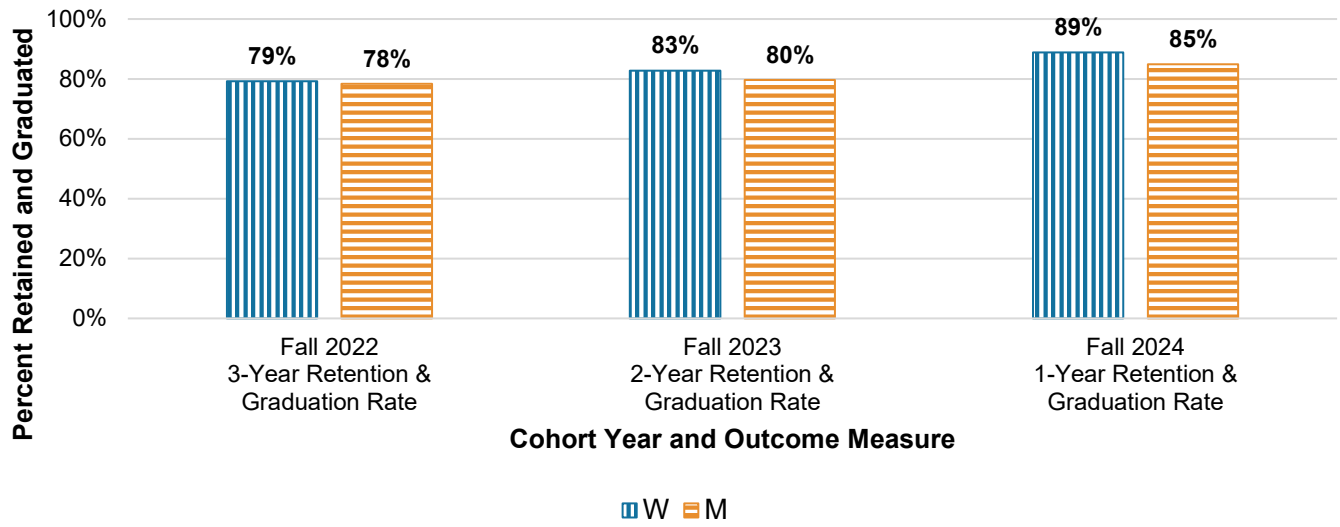
**Figure 3.1**

**Fall 2022 Cohort – Fall 2024 Cohort**

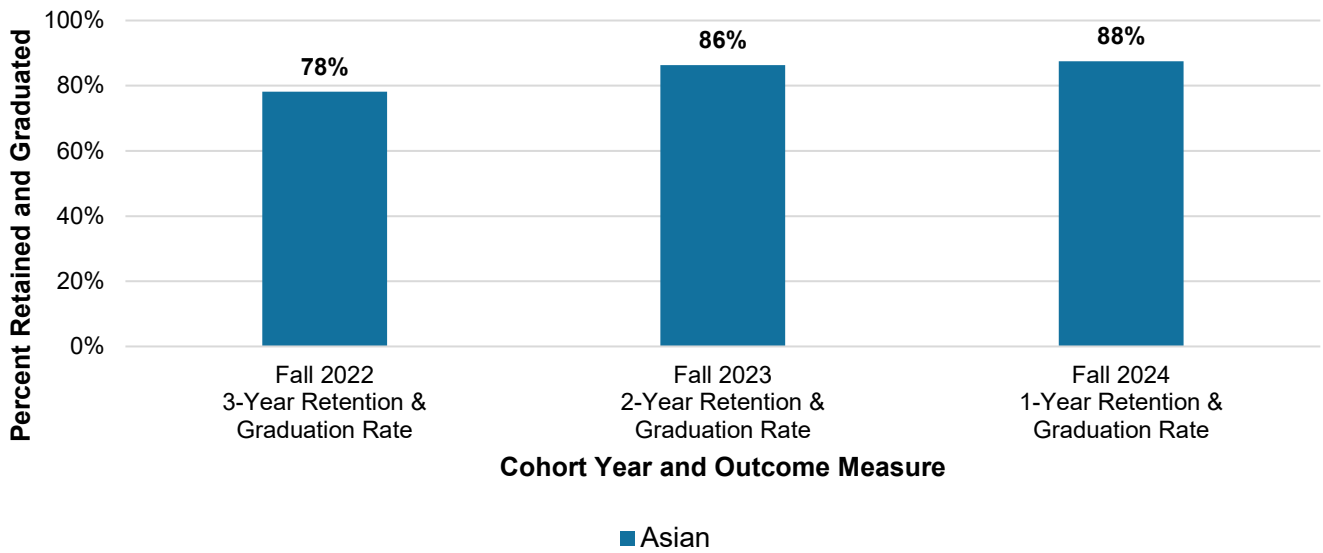


**Figure 3.4**

**(Panels A – I)**

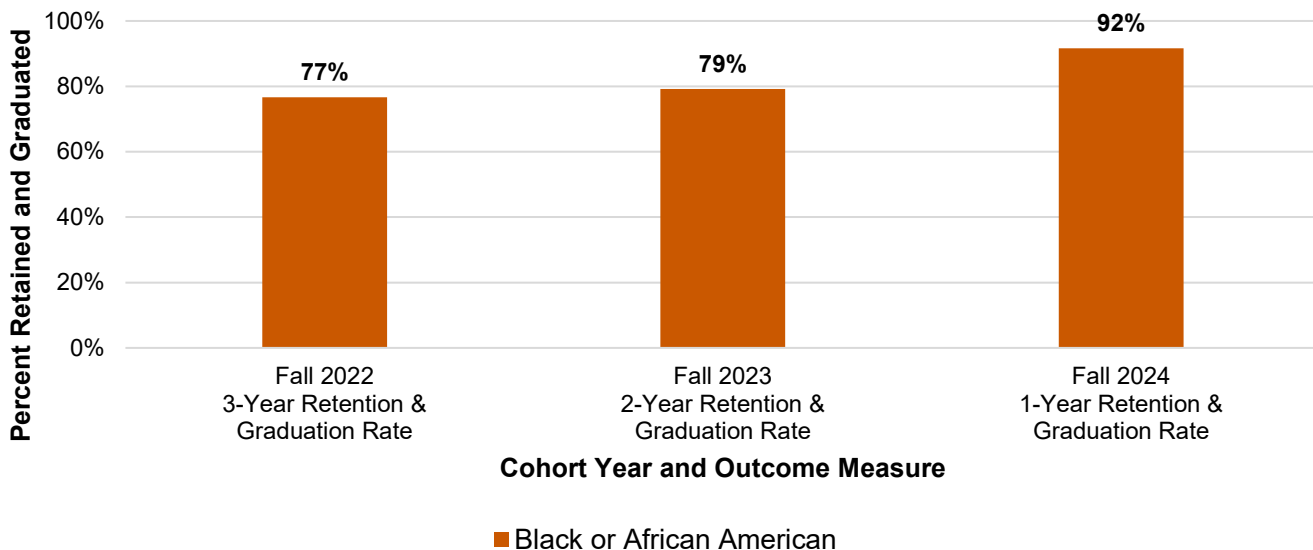

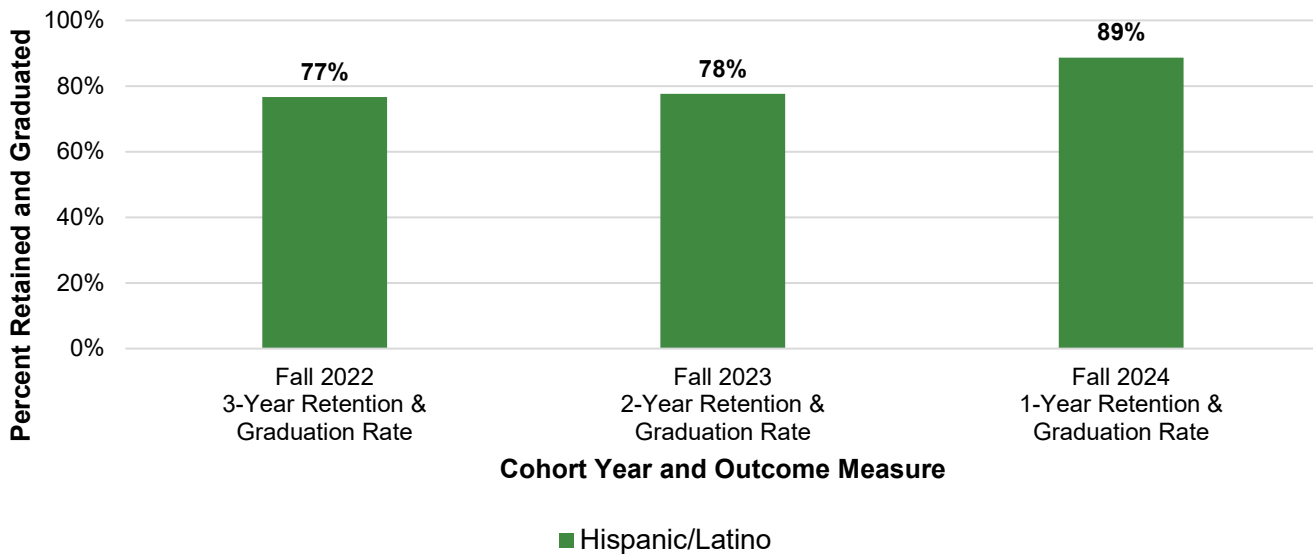

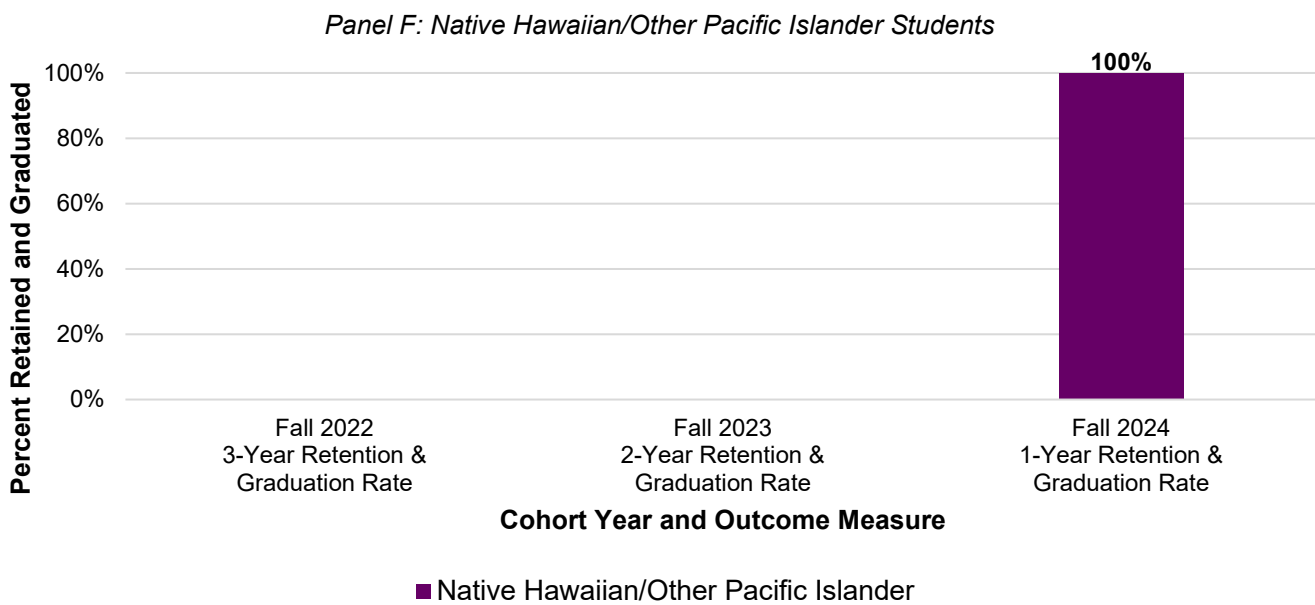
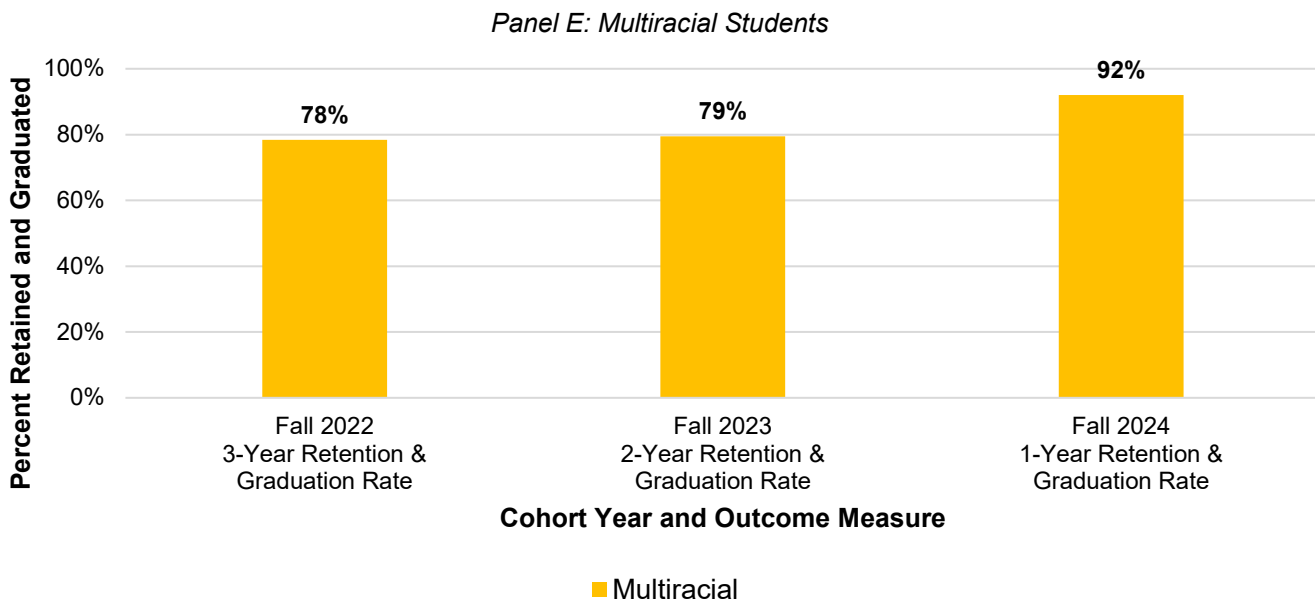

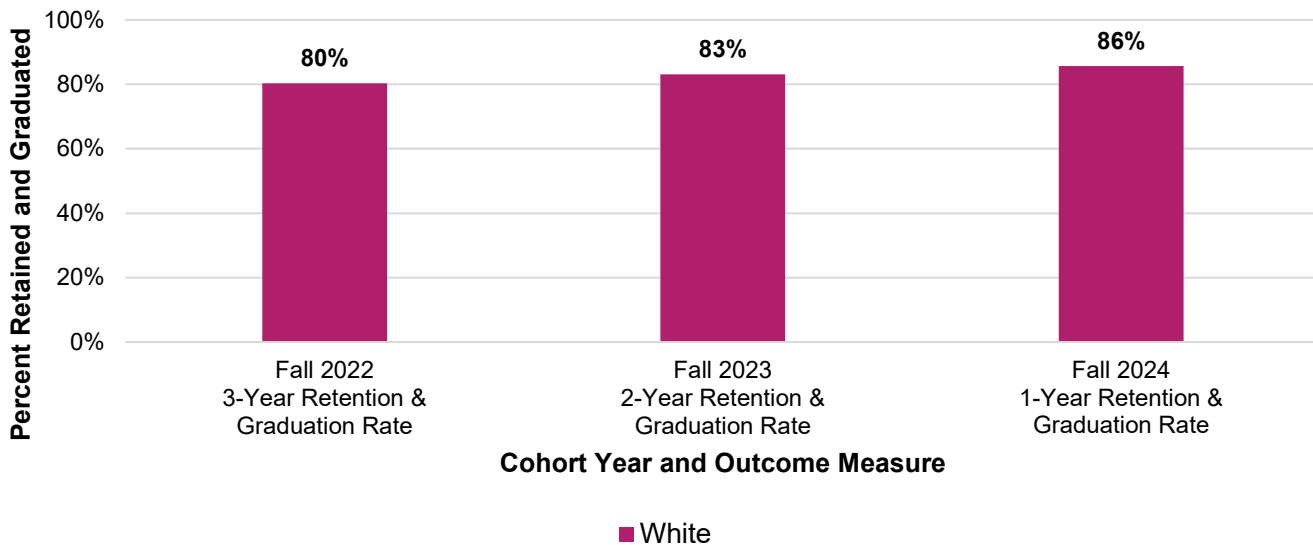

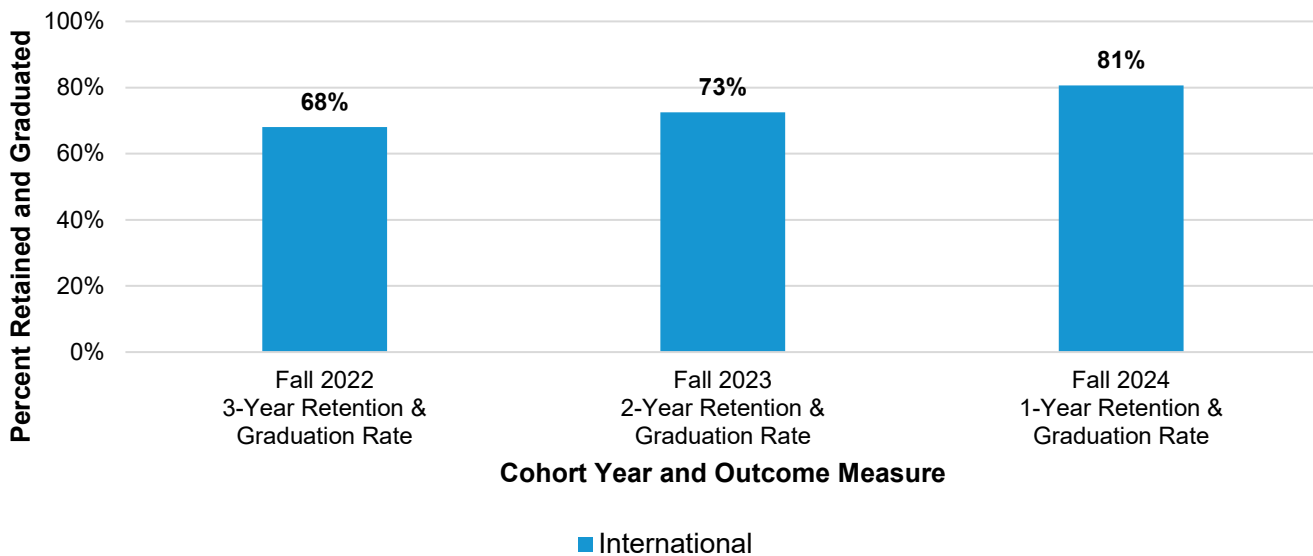




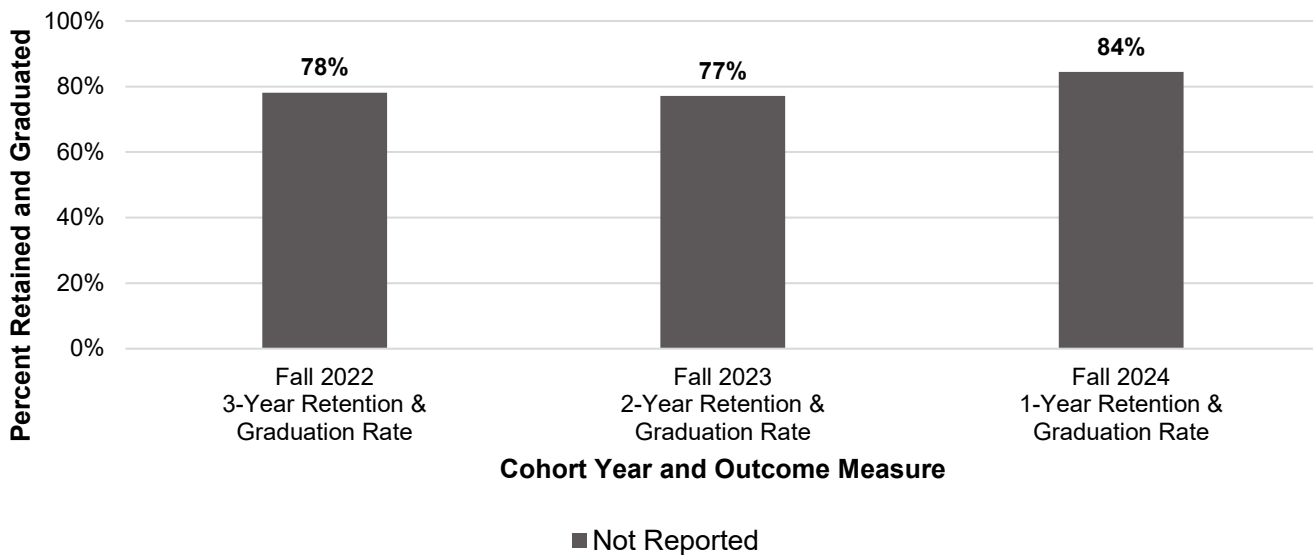

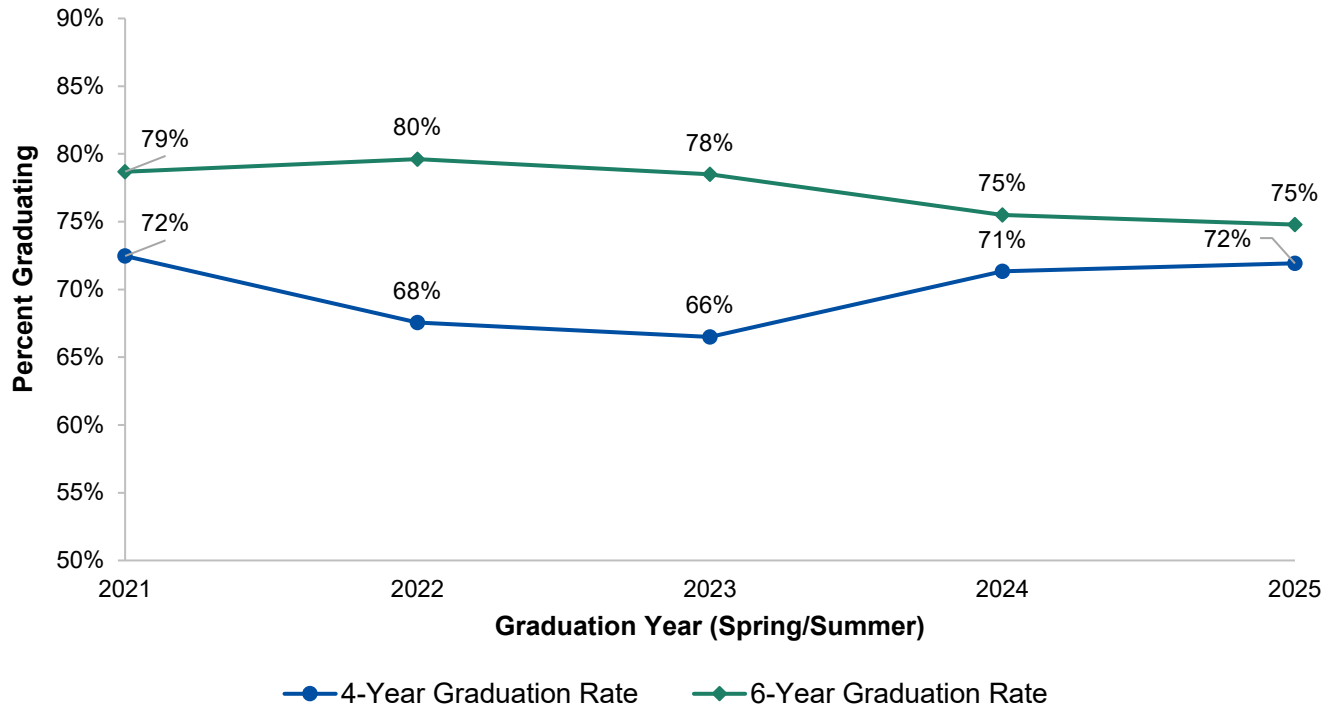

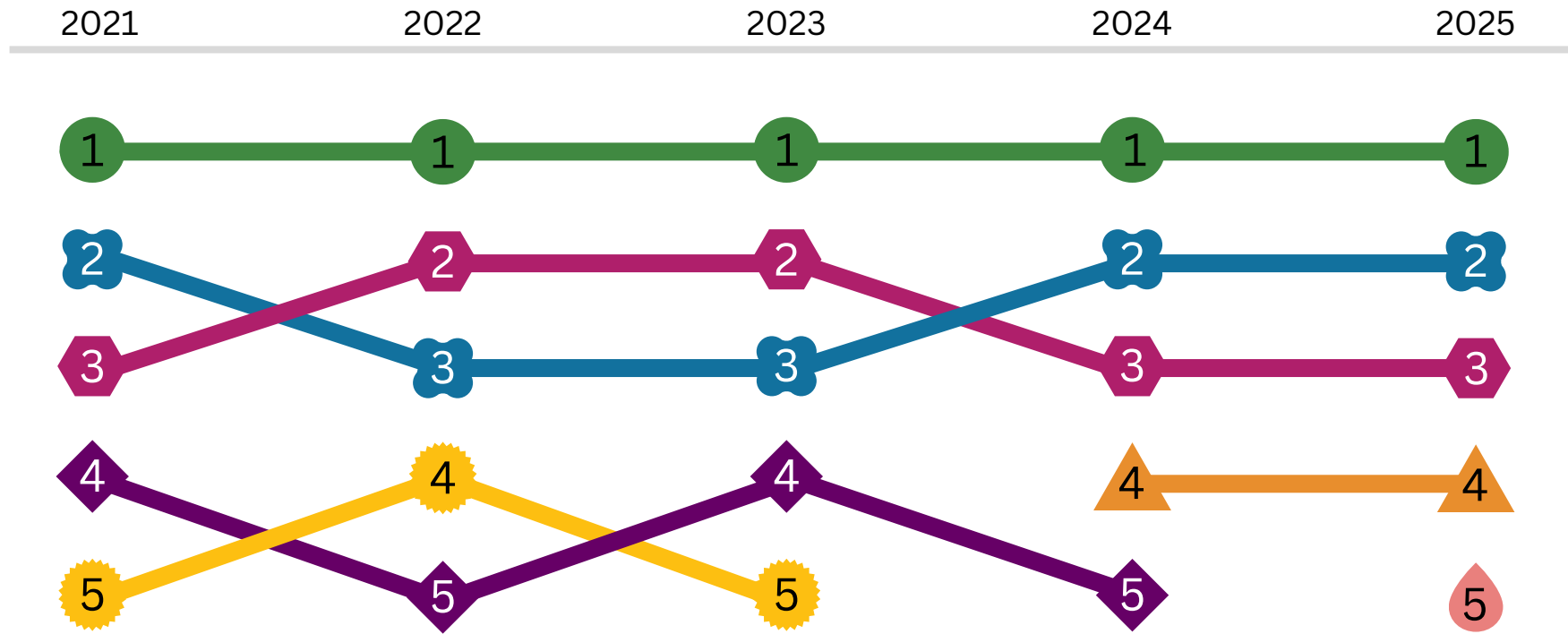

**Figure 4.1 Top 5 Bachelor's Majors at Graduation by Rank 2021-2025**

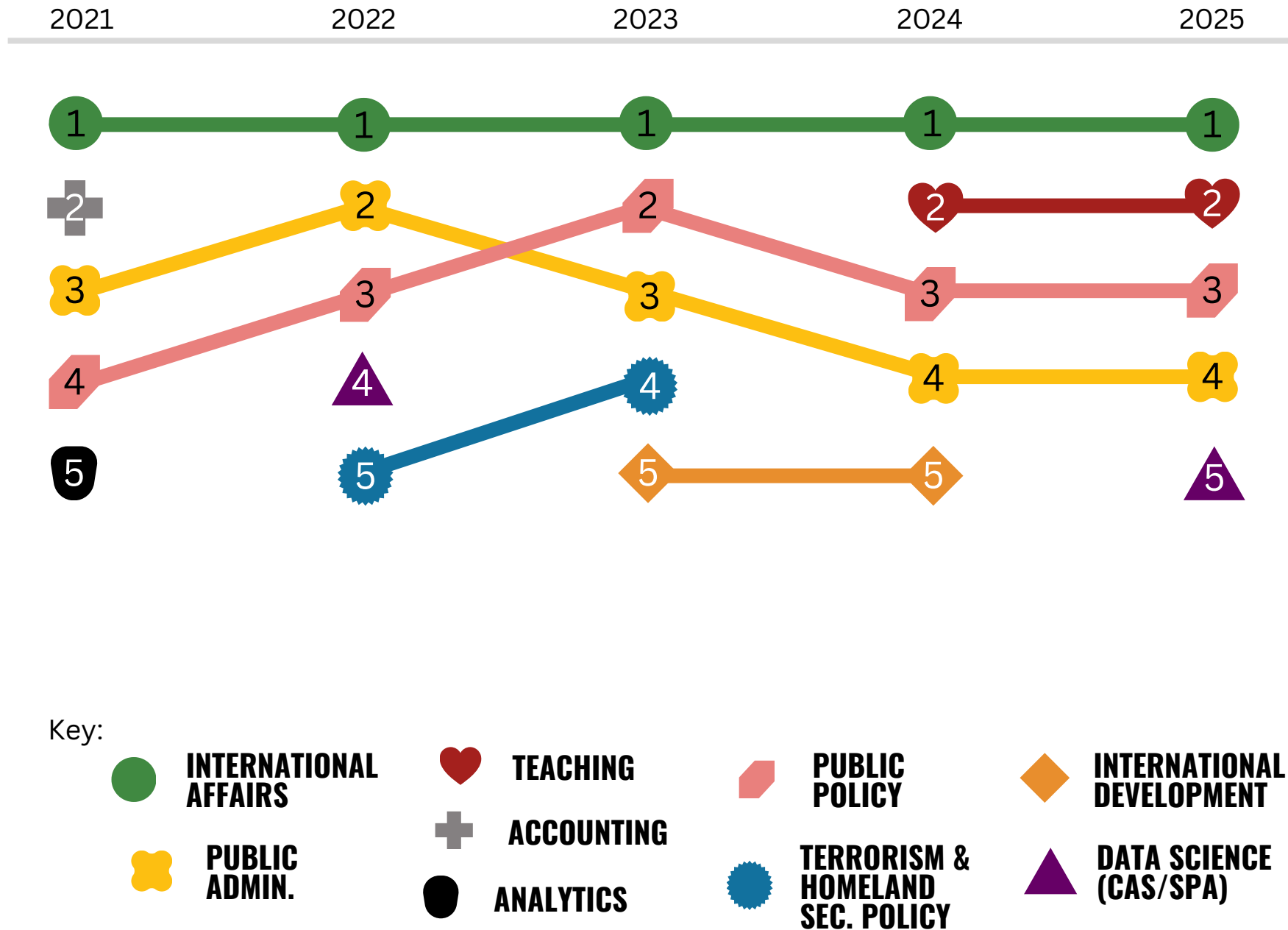

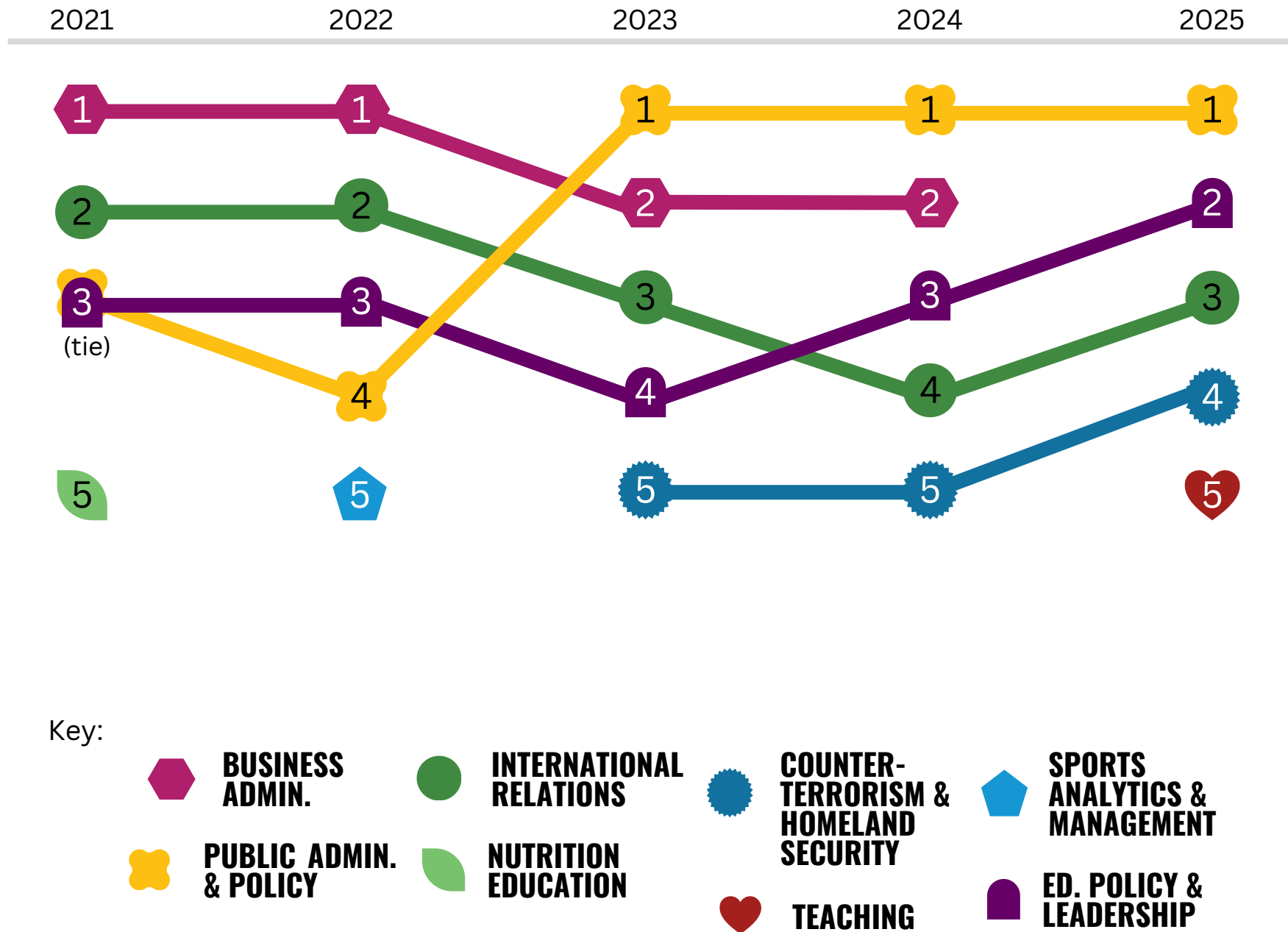

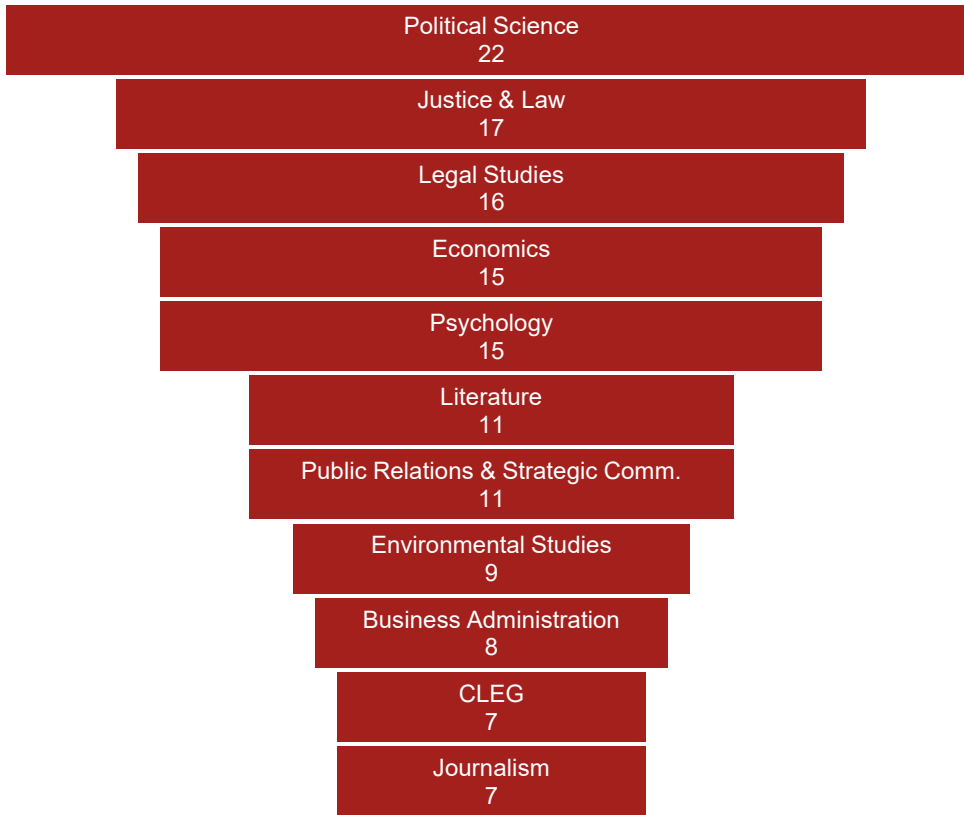

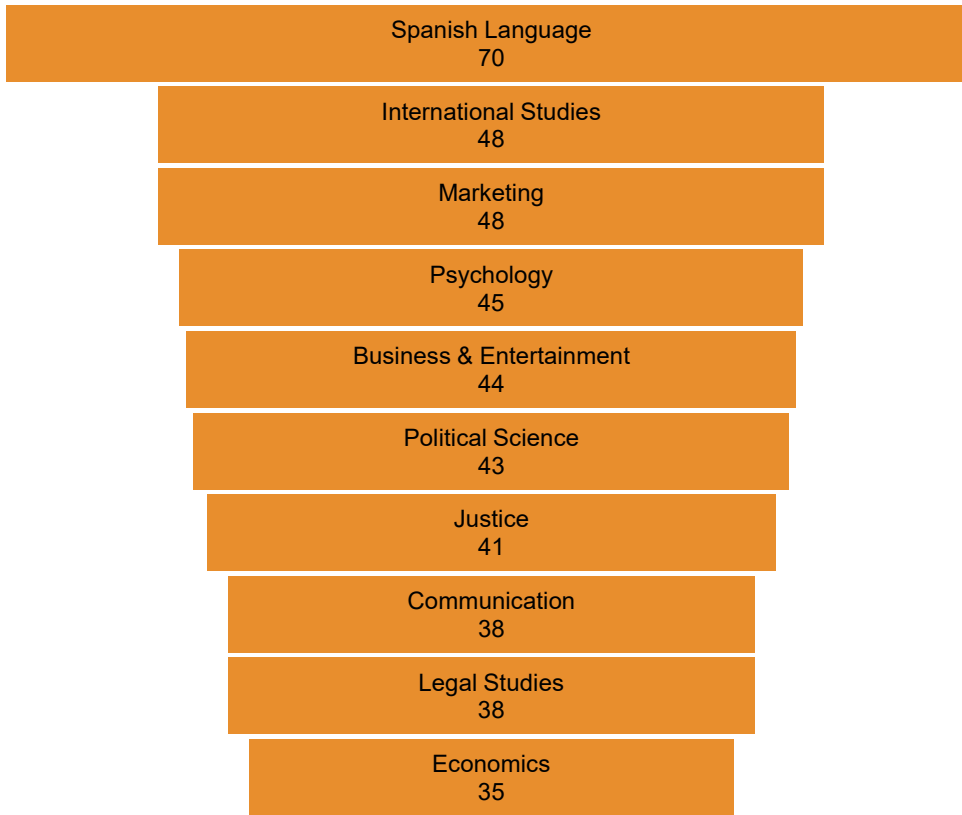
