While in residence, Hellman Fellows work with senior scientists and policy experts on critical national and international policy issues related to science, engineering, and technology. Must have a Ph.D in an area of science or engineering; must be eligible to work in U.S.; Fellows are expected to be in residency at AAAS in Cambridge, MA; one year term with possibility of renewal.
American Association of University Women (AAUW)	AAUW Research Leave Fellowships	\$30,000	November	Designed to assist female scholars in obtaining tenure and other promotions by enabling them to spend a year pursuing independent research; no residency requirement; must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident. Open to female scholars in any field of study. Not open to tenured professors.
American Council of Learned Societies (ACLS)	ACLS Collaborative Research Fellowships	\$60,000 in salary-replacement stipends for each collaborator, as well as up to \$21,000 in project funds. Total amount will depend on the number of collaborators and the duration of the research leaves but will not exceed \$201,000 for any one project.	September	Supports research in the humanities and related social sciences. Tenure of up to 24 months, including 6-12 months devoted to full-time research. No residency requirement. Collaborators can be from different institutions. Project Coordinator must have an appointment at a U.S.-based institution. A collaborative project must be constituted of at least two scholars who are each seeking salary-replacement stipends for six to twelve continuous months of supported research leave to pursue full-time collaborative research and writing during the fellowship tenure.

The ultimate goal of the project should be a major piece of scholarly work by the applicant, which can take the form of a monograph, articles, digital publication(s), critical edition, or other scholarly resources. The ACLS Fellowship program does not fund creative work (e.g., novels or films), textbooks, straightforward translation, or pedagogical projects. Tenure of 6-12 months devoted to full-time research. Ph.D must have been conferred at least 2 years before application deadline. No residency requirement but must be a U.S. citizen or have permanent residence. Variety of awards/fellowships available.
American Council of Learned Societies (ACLS)	Frederick Burkhardt Residential Fellowships for Recently Tenured Scholars	\$95,000, plus funds for research costs and related scholarly activities of up to \$7,500 and for relocation up to \$3,000	September	Supports long-term, unusually ambitious projects in the humanities and related social sciences. Open to recently tenured humanists. 9 month residential fellowship. Fellows will spend an academic year at one of the 12 national residential research centers participating in the program. Fellows do not need to be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, but must be employed in a tenured position at a degree-granting academic institution in the United States, remaining so for the duration of the fellowship. Previous supported research leaves do not affect eligibility.
Argonne National Laboratory	Faculty Sabbatical	Faculty member remains on the payroll and under the benefits program of the university. Typically, Argonne reimburses the university for 50 percent of salary and fringe benefits for the academic year.	No application deadline/	College and university faculty members may spend their sabbatical leave at Argonne. Appointments are normally for an academic or calendar year. The Faculty Research Leave Appointment (FRLA) Program is intended to provide mutual benefits to faculty members and the Laboratory. In addition to bringing about fruitful research activity, it provides Argonne scientists, engineers, and visiting faculty the opportunity to develop a strengthened rapport and to catalyze the formation of continuing research partnerships and collaborations. This can take the form of research collaboration, as well as more conventional interactions such as seminars and teaching. Also, when funding is available, faculty can involve qualified students from their home campus in their Argonne research program.

Council on Foreign Relations	International Affairs Fellowships	Varies	Varies	Provides opportunities for mid-career academics and professionals in the field of international relations to spend between six months and one year bridging the gap between the study and making of U.S. foreign policy. The program offers its fellows the chance to experience a new field and gain a different perspective at a pivotal moment in their careers. Academics are placed in public service and policy-oriented settings. Variety of types of awards and areas of study.
Department of Defense, Office of Naval Research	Office of Naval Research Summer Faculty Research & Sabbatical Leave Program	Receive a monthly stipend making up the difference between salary and sabbatical leave pay from their home institution. Relocation and travel assistance are provided to qualifying participants.	December	Supports participation of science and engineering faculty in research of mutual interest to the faculty member and peers at U.S. Navy Laboratories. The purpose of sabbatical leave is to provide an opportunity for faculty members to engage in scholarly, creative, professional, research, or other academic activities that will enhance the faculty member's further contributions to their institution. Minimum of one semester and maximum of one year. Open to U.S. citizens and legal permanent residents who hold teaching or research appointments at U.S. colleges and universities, but some restrictions may apply to permanent residents regarding eligibility for a DoD security clearance. The program is residential and all work must be completed on site at the sponsoring U.S. Navy Laboratory.
Ford Foundation	Fellowships	One year stipend of \$50,000	November	One year awards will be made to early career faculty and postdocs in the humanities, sciences, and social sciences who have demonstrated superior academic achievement, are committed to a career in teaching and research at the college or university level, show promise of future achievement as scholars and teachers, and are well prepared to use diversity as a resource for enriching the education of all students. Open to scholars who obtained PhD or ScD within the last seven years. Must be a U.S. citizen, national, or permanent resident.
Getty Foundation	Getty Scholars	Depends on length of residency, ranges from \$17,200-65,000	October	Getty Scholar Grants are for established scholars, or writers who have attained distinction in their fields. Recipients are in residence at the Getty Research Institute or Getty Villa, where they pursue their own projects free from academic obligations, make use of Getty collections, join their colleagues in a weekly meeting devoted to an annual research theme, and participate in the intellectual life of the Getty. 3-9 month residency.
Guggenheim Foundation	Guggenheim Fellowship	Varies	September	For mid-career awards for scholars who have already demonstrated exceptional capacity for productive scholarship in any field or exceptional creative ability in the arts. 6-12 months of support available. Former Guggenheim Fellows are not eligible to apply for another award.
Harry Ransom Center, UTexas Austin	Research Fellowship	\$3,500/ month for 1-3 month.	November	Supports fellowships for humanities projects that require substantial on-site use of the Center's collections in Austin, TX; range from 1 month-3 months; must have a Ph.D. or be an independent scholar with a substantial record of achievement; no citizenship requirement
Institute for Advanced Studies	The School of Historical Studies	Typically \$37,500 per semester	October	Must have several articles published in scholarly publications and must hold Ph.D (or equivalent) at time of application. The School of Historical Studies supports scholarship in all fields of historical research, but it is concerned principally with the following: Greek and Roman civilizations, Medieval Europe, Modern Europe, The Islamic World, Philosophy and International Relations, History of Art, East Asian Studies. Supports one or two semesters of residency at IAS in Princeton, NJ. No citizenship requirement.
Institute for Advanced Studies	The School of Social Science	Up to \$75,000	November	Scholars are drawn from a wide range of fields, notably political theory, economics, law, psychology, sociology, anthropology, history, philosophy, and literature. To facilitate scientific engagement among the visiting scholars, the School defines a theme for each year. Approximately one half of members selected pursue work related to it and contribute to a corresponding seminar, while the other half conduct their research on other topics. Awards are made to both junior and senior scholars. Fellowships are for full academic year residency at IAS in Princeton, NJ.

National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine	The NRC Research Associateship Programs (RAP)	NRC Research Associates receive annual stipends ranging from \$45,000 to \$80,000 for recent doctoral recipients and are proportionally higher for Senior Associates.	February, May, August, November (depending on laboratory)	The NRC Research Associateship Programs (RAP) promote excellence in scientific and technological research conducted by the U.S. government through the administration of programs offering graduate, postdoctoral, and senior level research opportunities at sponsoring federal laboratories and affiliated institutions. Open to foreign nationals and U.S. citizens.

National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine	Jefferson Science Fellows Program	The Fellow receives a stipend or per diem allowance of approximately \$50,000 to cover local living expenses and a \$10,000 travel budget for fellowship-related travel.	October	The JSF is open to tenured, or similarly ranked, faculty from U.S. institutions of higher learning who are U.S. citizens. The application period opens in early August and closes at the end of October. After successfully obtaining a security clearance, selected Jefferson Science Fellows spend one year on assignment at the U.S. Department of State or USAID as science advisors on foreign policy/international development issues. Assignments are tailored to the needs of the hosting office, while taking into account the Fellows' interests and areas of expertise. Following the fellowship year, Fellows will return to their academic career but will remain available to the U.S. government as an experienced consultant for short-term projects.

National Endowment for the Humanities	NEH Fellowship	\$5,000/ month for 6-12 months	April	Granted to individual scholars pursuing projects that embody exceptional research, rigorous analysis, and clear writing. Applications must clearly articulate a project's value to humanities scholars, general audiences, or both. Fellowships provide recipients time to conduct research or to produce books, monographs, peer-reviewed articles, e-books, digital materials, translations with annotations or a critical apparatus, or critical editions resulting from previous research. Projects may be at any stage of development. Invites research applications from scholars in all disciplines of the humanities, and it encourages submissions from independent scholars and junior scholars.
National Humanities Center	National Humanities Center Fellowship	Individually Determined	October	Residential Fellowships in Research Triangle Park, NC, for advanced study in the humanities; also accepts individuals from the natural and social sciences, the arts, the professions, and public life who are engaged in humanistic projects; must have Ph.D. or equivalent, and a record of publication; support available for junior and senior scholars; no citizenship requirement
New York Public Library	Cullman Center Fellowship	Up to \$70,000	September	Supports those who would benefit from access to the collections at the Stephen A. Schwarzman Building in New York NY, including academics and independent scholars in the humanities and social sciences, and creative writers. The Center appoints 15 Fellows a year for a nine-month term at the Library, from September through May. In addition to working on their own projects, the Fellows engage in an ongoing exchange of ideas within the Center and in public forums throughout the Library.

Applicants are invited to address the following proposition: New and radical forms of ownership, governance, entrepreneurship, and financialization are needed to fight pervasive economic inequality. Most fellowship terms are for one year, though the program will consider requests for shorter or longer durations; Foundation anticipates that most fellows will spend a portion of their fellowship term at one of the organization's main offices, in New York, Washington, London, Brussels, or Budapest, or at a regional foundation.

No citizenship requirements. Applicants who have spent more than 12 months of the last 3 years in France are not eligible.
Harvard University	Radcliffe Fellows	Fellows receive a stipend of \$77,500 plus an additional \$5,000 to cover project expenses. May also be eligible to receive relocation, housing, and childcare funds.	September or October depending on area of study	Radcliffe fellows are exceptional scientists, writers, scholars, public intellectuals, and artists whose work is making a difference in their professional fields and in the larger world. Based in Radcliffe Yard, fellows join a uniquely interdisciplinary and creative community. A fellowship at Radcliffe is an opportunity to step away from usual routines and dive deeply into a project. With access to Harvard's unparalleled resources, Radcliffe fellows develop new tools and methods, challenge artistic and scholarly conventions, and illuminate our past and our present. Throughout the year, fellows convene regularly to share their work in progress. Coming from diverse disciplines and perspectives, they challenge each other's ideas and support each other's ambitions. They award 50 fellowships per academic year.

Research carried out by Visiting Scholars constitutes an important part of the Foundation's ongoing effort to analyze and understand the complex and shifting nature of social and economic life in the United States. The Foundation annually awards about 17 residential fellowships to social scientists who are at least 3 years beyond the Ph.D. Visiting Scholar positions go from September to June.

Faculty fellowships are awarded across the spectrum of academic ranks (assistant, associate, and full professor) and a goal of the selection process is to create a diverse community of scholars. Applicants who are members of traditionally under-represented groups are encouraged to apply. There are no citizenship requirements for these fellowships. Non-U.S. nationals are welcome to apply. Awards are made from an applicant pool of approximately 350. Fellowships are for a full academic year and require being in residence near Stanford University.
The American Academy in Berlin	Berlin Prize	Fellowship benefits include round-trip airfare, housing at the Hans Arnhold Center, partial board, and a stipend of \$5,000 per month.	September	The American Academy in Berlin seeks to enrich transatlantic dialogue in the arts, humanities, and public policy through the development and communication of projects of the highest scholarly merit. The American Academy in Berlin is a private, independent, nonprofit institute for advanced study located in Berlin, Germany. Past recipients have included anthropologists, art historians, literary scholars, philosophers, historians, musicologists, journalists, writers, filmmakers, sociologists, legal scholars, economists, and public policy experts, among others. For all projects, the Academy asks that candidates explain the relevance of a stay in Berlin to the development of their work. Fellows are expected to be in residence at the Academy during the entire term of the award, generally one academic semester.

Applicants are strongly encouraged to contact staff members to help identify potential advisors, determine the feasibility of the proposed research being conducted at the Smithsonian Institution, and the availability of relevant resources such as staff, collections, archives and library materials during the proposed tenure dates. 3-24 months.
