

Reporting Internship with *The Durango Herald* – Spring 2019

[The Durango Herald](#) is seeking a reporter to cover the Colorado delegation on Capitol Hill. In addition to covering Sen. Cory Gardner, Sen. Michael Bennett and Rep. Scott Tipton, you may cover congressional committee and subcommittee hearings involving topics and issues important to Southwest Colorado residents. When appropriate, you will cover actions by various government departments, such as Interior.

You will work closely with Herald editors and the Herald's Denver Bureau Chief developing story ideas and projects. You will work closely with the press offices to stay abreast of developments. You will have the opportunity to cover national issues for a local and regional perspective, such as presidential addresses and gun-control legislation. You will be involved in political campaign coverage when necessary. You frequently will file stories on deadline. Your stories will appear in the print and online issues of *The Durango Herald* and *Cortez Journal*.

Pre-requisites:

- A minimum OVERALL GPA of 3.5 and no academic violations
- Reporting and social media proficiency
- Video and audio recording and editing skills a plus
- Must be a junior, senior or graduate student (after your first semester) with a major or minor in SOC

Dates & Hours:

- January - May
- 20 hours per week; schedule to be worked out with Durango Herald supervisor.
- **SITE VISIT: At the beginning of each internship period, the student travels to Durango, CO, at company expense to meet editors and the staff and for a tour of the area.**

Compensation: The Herald pays Dean's Interns a \$1,600 stipend; paid in four equal installments plus reimbursement for documented story-related expenses. You will be provided with a Herald press ID and credentials issued by the Senate Press Gallery.

Location: For this Washington Correspondent/Capitol Hill internship, the work is done remotely -- you will be on-site filing stories back to the newsroom.

**The Durango Herald hires interns throughout the year. If you are also interested in Summer 2019, you can also let Professor Perri know you'll be applying at a later date.*

Based on the strength of your application and a faculty review of applicants, the portfolios of top candidates who most strongly match the position's criteria will be shared with *The Durango Herald*. Their hiring supervisor will make the final decision. You **may** be contacted directly by *The Durango Herald* at any time following the application. Please let us know if you are offered the position since you will likely hear first.

SOC REQUIREMENTS for all Dean's Interns:

- Provide a headshot photo to be featured on SOC's [website](#) and flatscreens
- Submit a 250 word blog post with on-the-job action photos/selfies for the DI [Blog](#)
- Post at least once to social media about their experience and provide the link
- Students who successfully complete their Dean's Internship will be presented with the distinguished DI medallion to wear during Commencement.

Credit Information: If you would like academic credit for this Dean's Internship, contact your academic advisor directly to determine eligibility. If eligible, you must complete all registration and release forms, and enroll for internship supervision **prior** to the 'Add' course deadline.
