6) One letter of recommendation. This letter may be submitted by one of the three persons you've listed above as a reference. The letter should explain the recommender's relationship with you (for example professor, advisor); it should address your skills and your ability to complete the project you've proposed.

Students must submit electronic applications to Professor Bill Gentile <u>no later than</u> midnight of Monday 2 May 2022. Late submissions <u>will not be accepted</u>. No exceptions.
