

JGP Toolkit Transfer to NLADA's LegalAidResources.org

Frequently Asked Questions

This June 2021, The Justice in Government Project (JGP) Toolkit, including its Grants Matrices, library of research briefs with their easy-to-use bitesize findings, and COVID-19 and data resources, will move to NLADA's LegalAidResources.org page. Since 2017, American University's School of Public Affairs Justice-Related Initiatives (formerly, the Justice Programs Office) has been the home of the JGP.



JGP Transfer Frequently Asked Questions:

1. When will I be able to access the JGP Toolkit from LegalAidResources.org?

By June 30th, 2021 you will be able to access the JGP Toolkit and all of its resources on NLADA's LegalAidResources.org.

2. How will I find the Toolkit on LegalAidResources?

Once you go to <u>LegalAidResources.org</u>, you will find the "Justice in Government Project" dropdown in the black ribbon at the top. Select the dropdown and choose the page you wish to visit.

3. Will I still be able to access the Toolkit from American University's website?

By June 30th, the Toolkit and its resources will be on <u>LegalAidResources.org</u>. The link to the Toolkit homepage will redirect to the Toolkit on LegalAidResources.org; However, the <u>JGP Homepage</u> and the <u>JGP About page</u> will remain on American University's School of Public Affairs <u>Justice-Related Initiatives page</u>.

4. Will the links I have on my website and in documents for existing JGP modules and resources continue to work?

Yes, the existing links (to the Toolkit modules, Grant Matrix, and JGP homepage) will continue to work, although they will redirect you to the same resources on the LegalAidResources.org page. Some links to specific resources may redirect you to the Module where the resource will reside on the new page.

5. I'm not being redirected to the new location of a JGP page/resource and am having trouble finding it on LegalAidResources.org. What should I do?

Send an email to <u>resourcedesk@nlada.org</u> and someone will assist you with locating the resource or page.

6. What will change about the JGP Toolkit after the transfer?

- 1. You will have access to all the existing research and resources in the JGP Toolkit, except it will be in a new location on NLADA's LegalAidResources page.
- 2. You may notice some visual changes to the different modules as we are transferring to a different web host; However, the resources will be the same.
- 3. We are adding a fifth module to the usual four: our COVID-19 Resources. This module will have all the same research and resources as our current <u>COVID-19</u> <u>Resources Page</u>, including our ARP Funding Matrix, Spending Guidelines document, and our Federal Funding Chart for Non-LSC CARES Act Appropriations and Guidelines.

8. What is LegalAidResources.org, and what other resources can I find there?

NLADA's <u>Project to Advance Civil Legal Aid Collaborations</u> established LegalAidResources "to help civil legal aid programs and other equal justice advocates find federal funding to support their work." The site provides different funding resources, information, and tools for Executive Directors, Development Directors, and Grant writers; ATJ Commissions; and Pro Bono Programs. The site's content--including funding opportunities and express language for legal aid--is sorted by issue area, population served, and federal agency/entity.
